TODAY'S ANALYSIS - by Dan Illman

> RACE 1

1. THE AMAZING MIZZEN

1A-4-6-7

2. ROZZYROO

3. LADY ENSIGN

First post is 12:10 ET with low 12% takeout on "Value Pick 5" wagers. **THE AMAZING MIZZEN** won sprinting last spring, and finished off her campaign earning respectable Beyers in longer races. Tracked the favored pacesetting winner last time, went on a hard chase, then understandably tired in between. Think she'll settle back and let others do the dirty chasing work for barn that sent out route to turf sprint winners Carolina Hideaway (5-2 odds) and Run Around Slew (9-2) off similar layoffs last year. **ROZZYROO** switches surfaces by a young sire that went 9 for 30 (30%) with first-turf performers. Although there isn't much turf in the female family, there's plenty of class, so perhaps she'll move forward. Tiz the Law - Smart Strike breeding nick produced recent Gulfstream stakes-winning turf sprinter Cloe (86 Beyer). **LADY ENSIGN** prompted outside the 14-1 winner, then couldn't go with that one on turf two back. Hazlewood lands here instead of Sharmin and Rapido Rosa. CONCEPTUALIZE got cooked going 22.02 and 45.28 off the layoff at Turfway. Might not have to work as hard to make the lead. BIG WANDA raced greenly in the early stages of lone turf start, fell far behind, swung widest, altered course inside the drifting winner, and gave a strong kick to prevail. Wore bar shoes in two subsequent dirt outings, but seems better on the grass. Toledo departs for JUSTHEART, who races on turf for the first time since facing two next-out winners in that 10/24 Aqueduct heat.

>> RACE 2

1. SHE'SAROLLINGSTONE

2. ALWAYS LAUGHING

3. DATE NIGHT KISSES

SHE'SAROLLINGSTONE tracked in between horses, dropped into the pocket on the second turn, angled three wide turning for home, then was kicked down by a class-dropping closer. Seems tactical enough to work out a midpack trip for barn that went 25 for 86 (29%, \$2.00 ROI) between 3/28 and 4/16. **ALWAYS LAUGHING** got away with an easy lead when dominating conditioned claimers at Penn National in first for this barn. She's shown the ability to rate and finish if necessary, but think she'll be squarely in the thick of things when the field turns into the long stretch. **DATE NIGHT KISSES** was forced to make a premature and wide move into a slow pace at Penn National, then just missed to favored Jess's Gypsy Girl. Think she'll get a better race flow this time around for barn that sent out 19-1 winner Lord's Lady here on 4/12. QUIT QUAY steps up in class and distance in search of hat trick after pushing a solid pace to a sprint score. Expecting her to get close to the lead once again. Rodriguez departs for PATTY CAKES, who took advantage of speed-friendly track in first for this barn. A little class relief could go a long way for MAXIMO MADNESS, who parlayed a quick pace into a rallying dead-heat runner-up finish.

1. BUILD BY KHOZAN

2. BULLY FOR YOU

3. TWAIN

Although **BUILT BY KHOZAN**'s sire only connects with 4% of first-turf performers, the colt is a half-brother to stakes-placed turf sprinter Fulminate (85 turf/synthetic Beyer) out of a half to stakes-placed turf sprinter Anyriderill Do (89 turf Beyer). Couldn't step with Verifire, a \$1M first-time starter that

popped a 92 Beyer in that Colonial race on 3/15, but should show speed from the fence. Barn went 4 for the last 17 (24%, \$2.08 ROI) between 3/23 and 4/13. Hazlewood lands here instead of Great Artist. Wish there was more turf and precocity in **BULLY FOR YOU**'s pedigree as the sire only hits at 6% with first-turf runners and 8% with all first-time starters. That being said, he shows solid workouts with the April 3 drill matching the barn's 4-year-old filly Lorraine. That filly hit the board in five of eight with a 68 synthetic Beyer top. Perhaps they went in company. The second dam was a stakes-winning dirt sprinter (76 dirt Beyer). Barn popped with a 37-1 debut runner on turf at Pimlico a few years ago. **TWAIN** (\$80,000 weanling) is bred both sides for turf being by grass champion Kitten's Joy out of stakes-winning turf router Camila Princess (88 turf Beyer). The second dam was a stakes-winning dirt sprinter (won debut; 75 turf Beyer). Barn sent out 4-1 debut winner Mr. Keys on 2/23. MY LUCKY ACE was overmatched in lone turf start against Thick as Thieves, who returned to graduate for \$30,000 at Fair Grounds with a 71 Beyer. ENZO tried to rally in a slow-paced race on turf two back, a heat that produced two next-out winners. Well-bred gelding kicks hard late.

$\rangle\rangle$ RACE 4

1. FIELD OF ROSES

2. FAIR TRADE

3. VIEUX CARRE

FIELD OF ROSES might be a bit "dressed-up" as she controlled a slow pace at Mahoning Valley in a race where the two favorites ran 1-2 around the track. Pressured by the 7-5 runner-up, she drew off in the lane. That being said, she's the lone three-time winner in the field, and should get close to the pace once again. Barn sent out repeat winner Shape Note moving allowance to claiming at Colonial on 3/13. Lopez lands here instead of Blessed Candy. FAIR TRADE got the right trip and setup when placing at this level three weeks ago. Stalked outside, found good position behind a hot three-ply pace duel, made a three-wide bid under confident handling, then stayed for second after being late to change leads. The pace should be to her liking once again for barn that sent out two winners here on 3/30. VIEUX CARRE showed them her heels in her Penn National debut, and now gets Lasix with the speed to get up and on the pace from her inside draw. Barn went 2 for the last 10 (20%, \$4.70 ROI) on dirt in Maryland. CAN DO drops in class with good early speed.

>> RACE 5

1. GOLDEN ROCKET

2. PRETTY LIAM

3. VISBY

Both of **GOLDEN ROCKET**'s turf sprints are good, including a late-kicking win against New York breds last fall. Broke sharp in that heat, dropped back to save ground at the tail of the field, eased three wide, and ran them down. Expecting a stretch rally given the right pace and trip scenario. Rodriguez lands here instead of Afandi. **PRETTY LIAM** switches surfaces as a half-sister to Grade 3-winning turf router Danse Macabre. Not away the best from the rail last time, she tracked from the pocket, then finished evenly on the fence. Has more tactical speed than the top two picks for barn that went 3 for the last 12, 25%, \$2.20 ROI) with experienced horses getting blinkers for the first time. **VISBY** drops and adds Lasix after facing two next-out winners with the third-finisher next taking a \$32,000 optional at Tampa with an 86 Beyer. Broke slow two back, split foes turning for home, then rallied well for second despite briefly swapping leads a couple of times in the stretch. Know her in the final furlong. Wonder if PRECIOUS AVARY is using this as a prep as she returns from 161-day break. Cooked up in a speed duel going two turns in her final start last year, she can get close to the pace. INDEPENDENCE AVENUE seems well-entered moving back to turf and dropping in class for her second start of the year.

>> RACE 6

1. STICKWITHTHECOLORS

2. SHEILAHS WARCLOUD

3. MY FLICKER

STICKWITHTHECOLORS, listed as a Laurel vet scratch (sick) on 3/30, seeks fourth straight win after gritty gate-to-wire score in the restricted Conniver last month. Bounced out to an uncontested lead through a quick second quarter in 23 flat, then just had enough to hold the closers at bay. Beat two next-out winners, and the third-finisher then placed in a second-level allowance with an 85 Beyer. Drew outside the other main speed, and should be squarely in the mix when the real running begins. **SHEILAHS WARCLOUD** saved ground in midpack, made a four-wide bid through a quick second quarter of 22.59, then kept going to prevail at Colonial. There's a good chance she gets a nice race flow once again. **MY FLICKER** saved ground in midpack, angled to split rivals three wide, eased five wide into the stretch, then stayed on to best two of these at Colonial. Might be racing herself back into shape for barn that went 5 for the last 11, 45%, \$2.62 ROI) third after 180-365 day layoffs. SUSAN'S MULE, listed as a Colonial vet scratch on 3/13, won her final two starts last year, and overcame strong pace pressure from the third-finisher to score on 12/6. The fourth-finisher next won a \$32,000 claimer in New York with a 71 Beyer.

>> RACE 7

1. CUT FROM CLASS

2. SPARKLE BLUE

3. TUFANI

CUT FROM CLASS ran very well in the Big Dreyfus when beaten less than a length, then might have felt the effects of a long campaign when a tiring fourth in the All Along. Set the pace on the rail in the latter race, couldn't steal away under a pretty confident ride, then faltered in the final eighth. Think this shorter distance is just what the doctor ordered, and she can get close to the pace. Millionaire **SPARKLE BLUE** ran down the top pick in the Big Dreyfus, then likely gained good fitness over the winter at Tampa Bay. Rated back to pocket position in a race that sped up drastically during the middle part, came up the rail in upper stretch, and finished evenly while in a bit tight. Class relief helps this late-kicker, who breezed outside Group 1 winner Gimme a Nother on 4/13 at Fair Hill, finishing a head behind after five furlongs. **TUFANI** raced behind a solid pace, then finished well for second behind the favorite at Fair Grounds last month. Barn sent out 10-1 turf winner Think Big at Keeneland on 4/8. PURE MAJESTIC tries older horses with the speed to get forward. No match for Admit last time over synthetic, and that one then ran third in the Bourbonette Oaks at Turfway with a 77 Beyer.

>> RACE 8

1. DETERMINED KINGDOM

2. HAD TO HAVE HIM

3. SWILL

DETERMINED KINGDOM was purchased for \$190,000 at public auction following an impressive fourth-level allowance win at Keeneland. Tracked a quick 21.11 opening quarter from the pocket, squeezed and bulled his way through in between horses in upper stretch, then drew away late. Expect him to get close to the pace for barn went 7 for the last 27 (26%, \$4.17 ROI) after a trainer switch and following a 120-180 day layoff. Think **HAD TO HAVE HIM** will benefit returning from 140-day break as a new gelding. Pinched at the start on turf two back, he stalked outside, eased out into the lane, then swapped leads several times in the stretch. Barn sent out 2-1 winner Happy Hour Joker here last week. **SWILL**, listed as a Laurel vet scratch (sick), on 12/14, beat four of these in final start of 2024. Prompted the favored runner-up from the outside, went on a hard chase turning into the long stretch, then outlasted them despite hopping back to his left lead. Barn went 3 for the last 13 (23%, \$6.77 ROI) returning from 120-180 day layoffs.

>> RACE 9

1. COMPLEXITY JANE

2. SAFE TRUST

3. MOON CACHE

COMPLEXITY JANE was a very professional debut winner. Bounced around at the start, she settlef into a rhythm, then rallied up the fence to overcome a speed-friendly track. Broke inward stretching out to a mile last month, she set the pace inside the 7-2 last-finisher, opened up turning for home, then was nailed in the waning strides. Figures close to the pace for barn that went 9 for the last 24 (38%, \$2.35 ROI) with second-time routers. **SAFE TRUST** wheels back on short notice after kicking down sprinters over a closer-friendly track. Urged along to keep pace with fractions of 22.71 and 23.64, she swung widest, then ran them down with a nice flurry. Just missed going a one-turn mile when promoted to first via disqualification, but this extra distance is a question mark. **MOON CACHE** a very dangerous contender after game Beyond the Wire run. Tracked a very fast pace, made an early bid to the lead in upper stretch, then stayed gamely only to be penalized by the stewards. Beat two next-out winners that day, and can settle into another good tracking position despite the far outside post. REPLAY acts like she'll run all day long. Tracked a fast pace from a loose pocket at Colonial, was urged along on the turn, then kept finding more in the stretch. Big step up in class.

>> RACE 10

1. NEAT

2. MISCHIEVOUS ANGEL

3. CARD TRICK

Grade 2 winner **NEAT** found a tough spot in his 2025 debut when facing Grade 1 foes in Santa Anita's Frank E. Kilroe. Stalked outside at the back behind a moderate pace, eased out three wide, then never threatened. The seventh-finisher then won the Grade 3 San Simeon there with a 94 Beyer. Specializes at this distance, and kicks on well in the stretch. **MISCHIEVOUS ANGEL** settled into the pocket in the Grade 3 Belmont Turf Sprint, then couldn't finish with two next-out winners with Determined Kingdom returning to win a fourth-level Keeneland allowance with a 99 Beyer. Won off a similar layoff last year for barn that went 3 for the last 12 (25%, \$2.09 ROI) moving sprint to route. **CARD TRICK** has excellent tactical speed, and utilized it to full effect when earning career-best Beyer in second-level allowance at Tampa. Might work out a nice pace-tracking, ground-saving journey. Trainer-jockey combination scored off the trainer switch with 9-1 Quint's Brew in the Jennings on 1/18. OCEAN CITY has big speed, but might relax better as a new gelding. Faced two next-out winners at Fair Grounds with the eighth-finisher taking two of his next three with a 93 Beyer top. Late-running SIGNATOR got the pace help he needed when winning his turf debut. Faces tougher, but ran some nice races on dirt earlier in his career, and the barn often gets them better as they mature.

) RACE 11

1. KENTUCKY OUTLAW

2. SURFSIDE MOON

3. PAY BILLY

We'll learn a great deal more about **KENTUCKY OUTLAW** as he steps up in class and distance following two blowout wins at Parx. Broke in a bit in twoturn debut, pulled very hard when setting the pace while just off the rail, then received a beautiful breather through a slow second quarter in 24.76. That was all she wrote for the rest of the field, as he sprinted home to win. He's a naturally fast horse that can make the lead here, but it is imperative for him to settle better heading into the backstretch. **SURFSIDE MOON** has improved greatly with additional distance, and he gave a fine effort when second in the Withers at nine furlongs. Found a comfortable stalking spot, made a four-wide bid into contention on the second turn, then couldn't finish with the favorite. Missed some time with illness after that race, but should get a fair pace to attack in the stretch. **PAY BILLY** tracked three wide around both turns in the Private Terms, then was too good for that group. Tactical sort has enough speed to find good forward position on the first turn, and looks and acts like he'll stay the extra distance.

1. SOUTHERN DISTRICT

2. MR JEFFERSON

3. WALK AWAY JOE

SOUTHERN DISTRICT saved ground at the back behind the pacesetting winner's quick splits of 24.22 and 23.93, made a four-five wide bid on the second turn, then finished evenly behind both halves of the odds-on entry. He has back races that would make him competitive. **MR JEFFERSON** settled three wide at the back behind a quick pace, made an inside bid, angled five wide to split horses in upper stretch, then might have found that state-sired allowance too tough. The winner of that heat then hit the board twice in open second-level heats with Beyers of 81 and 78. Rosado departs for Toast to Coast. **WALK AWAY JOE** finished ahead of three of these, including the top pick, when wired by Berks. Found good position in midpack behind the quick pace, made a four-wide bid on the second turn, was placed on a hard two-wide chase at the quarter pole, then stayed on for second. ENERGY EFFICIENT didn't break smooth in his last two, but he has enough speed to make the lead given a clean start. Pushed a quick 23.92 second quarter in a race that went to closers last time, and might not have to work as hard early in here. SUPREME SONG seems well-entered after facing Tycoon, who returned to win a nickel conditioned claimer at Parx with a 64 Beyer.

KALI'S KEY – by Kali Francois

Race 8: The King T Leatherbury Stakes

#3 Prince of Jericho

In a full field of 12, and I go with the first horse amongst my top three? Plenty of reasons, outside of the fact that he's on a roll and pretty much near top form.

His dam was a multiple listed stakes mare routing on the turf in Canada. She also ran several times on the first before having her successful turf career.
His grandma was a decent fourth in the Garden City Stakes on the turf, now known as the Belmont Oaks (1 1/4 Oaks, Garden City 1 1/8) 3. In his first race, Brittany had him entered on the grass going 5.5 4. Watching him, he looks like he feels he could handle the second surface well enough - his stride has a 'grabbing' factor to it that I think will appreciate the fresh turf, and hopefully, give him a sense of fresh air in his lungs.

MACK'S FACTS – by Mackenzie Pfeiffer

R1: 10-1 ML on the #10 Rozzyroo, perhaps she gets to be the outside speed and recover from 2 tough trips since the maiden win. 2nd Dam was a multiple graded stakes winning sprinter, sire hits ~25% for turf sprinters.

R2: She'sarollingstone has been consistent at this level over the late winter and early spring, just missing out as a deep closer snuck by last time out. Should be an honest pace inside and looks to sit the right trip.

R3: Enzo will be the big name in the room as he returns for his 4 y/o season. The half sibling to Caravel and full sibling to Witty, he has taken a bit more time to find his way. The barn typically excels with 2nd/3rd off the bench, I look to beat him with the inside speed and potentially a better value in Built by Khozan.

R4: Field of Roses show the ability on debut and second asking, nice confidence building move to get back in form after troubled trips. Looks to be the quickest on the outside and can play her way in here.

R5: Visby comes in second off the bench, following her 2025 debut in the Lightning City, where she picked up right as she left off. Key player and familiar company will be Gift of Gab, she hit the board in 6/7 starts last season.

R6: Stickwiththecolors was able to control things all the way last out in the Conniver, I just don't see her having it that easy with Susan's Mule just to her inside. Should be an honest setup for the closers.

R7: I find myself aligning with horses who really fit the distance here, including a price in the #5. I ultimately use Fantastical on top as she has tactical ability, keeps good company, and comes in after a win on 3/20.

R8: Fore Harp on the inside likely sets the stage for early pace. Determined Kingdom will have the option to press or sit chilly and stalk, he is 4/5 in the winners circle here at LRL in turf sprints...the only miss being a wide trip. Ultimately, I find Prince of Jericho highly attractive as he should work out a close stalking trip and benefits from a solid base fitness. Witty will look to defend his title with a late run, perhaps a tougher group this year than last.

R9: Will be curious to see who goes on for the pace, likely Late Nite Call who wears a target in the early stages. Complexity Jane, Safe Trust, and Moon Cache have benefitted from being able to sit close without doing the heavy lifting in routing efforts, could work out for them here. Reply seems a short price but she may benefit from a pace setup and others challenging early.

R10: Looks to have an honest pace and feels the type of race where you can find value. Lasix and distance are my angles for this spot, some of them jump out when applying these factors. Degree of Risk seems a great value as he is consistent over the turf mile.

R11: Kentucky Outlaw arrives as the clear pace, some question if anyone will challenge it early. The outside posts for Pay Billy and Just a Fair Shake could be significant, offering flexibility in their tactics. Surfside Moon worked well from the inside in the Withers, he looks to sit a similar trip and could improve 2nd time going the distance.

R12: Seems a few runners here would prefer the front end and haven't been able to make it happen in recent outings. Kick Startness is an interesting type, claimed back 2 starts after losing him against much tougher, you might just have to buy into the connections for this one.

Race 7: Dahlia S., 3YO+F, 1m, Turf

HORSE	RACE	TRIP NOTE
GOURMET	SA, Pen, 1m 70yds, fast, 03/21/25 – 4th	GOUR broke sharp under minimal urging before being restrained to stalk the pace 3-4W. ~7/16 pole, she came under a ride & seemed to responded willingly, however, she was also giving away plenty of ground racing 5W on the turn & struggled to advance. She stayed on gamely at one pace to the wire late but lost 3 rd to a closing foe on the wire. She was game in defeat and her wide trip probably cost her 3rd but she was never winning. Okay run .
SPARKLE BLUE	Hillsborough S, Tam, 1 1/8m, firm, 03/08/25 – 5th	SB broke well from the rail draw, then had to ease back as the leaders crossed heading into the far turn. She traveled well tacking the pace in the pocket to the far turn, then came under encouragement as the pace increased turning for home. She stayed on well & remained competitive along the rail towards the wire, however, it was too tight inside for her rider to really get aggressive in the drive & she was only hand ridden through the stretch, losing two positions to strong closing foes late. Nice effort off the bench. Ignore the chart comment 'checked early' – that was of no significance. She sat a perfect trip into the stretch but was then tight along the rail & hand ridden through the stretch – can improve for the run & for a cleaner stretch run. Solid effort in a tough race.
CUT FROM CLASS	Alw, CT, 6 1/2f, good, 11/23/24 – 3rd	Having broken from the rail, CFC closely tracked the pace in the pocket to ~3/8 pole where she was then encouraged to keep up with the leading duo who increased the pace. She became outpaced & dropped back under a strong ride before plugging on at one pace to the wire. Had a perfect rail pocket position tracking slowish pace but was then outpaced in the second half of the race. Will be suited by further.
FANTASTICAL	Alw, TP, 6 1/2f, synth, 03/20/25 – 1st	Despite cutting back in trip, FAN showed good early speed before settling in behind the pace where she chased between horses. Somewhat surprisingly, leading trainer Brittany Russell is just 2-for-26 (8%) with last out maiden winners in stakes races, even though twelve of those runners were sent off at odds of under 5/1. REPLY may therefore not be a lock from the rail draw in today's Weber City Miss S. and so instead, why not take a bigger price about MOON CACHE. Despite being disqualified for bumping the re-opposing SAFE TRUST near the finish in the Beyond The Wire S. last time, Mike Gorham's trainee delivered a standout performance at odds of 17/1, powering through a three-wide move on the turn before she surged to the lead with authority, crossing the line a nose in front. Just like when she scored two starts back and earned glowing remarks in ITM's Post Race Trip Notes, there seemed to be no fluke about the performance, and as she now returns to the track for today's Weber City Miss S., she has a perfect opportunity to go well again. Her form and consistently improving Beyer speed figures slot nicely amongst her rival's and with an ideal post position draw in gate seven, from where she can use her tactical speed to best effect, she could simply emerge as being the best horse sitting the best trip. Note: trainer Mike Gorham and jockey Raul Mena boast a 24% win rate (\$2.05 ROI) with dirt horses coming off a career-best Beyer.

R10: DEGREE OF RISK (8/1 ML)

With speedballs OCEAN CITY and HAMMER set to line up in today's one-mile Henry S. Clark S., DEGREE OF RISK could get an ideal pace set-up to run well at a price. The 6-year-old son of CAIRO PRINCE has really stepped forward since joining the Nolan Ramsey barn last summer and won very well last time. As you can see from the above trip notes, he pulled hard behind modest fractions, then waited for room, found room out wide and kicked like a fresh horse to score at Gulfstream Park with a solid 85 Beyer. He ran in a manner to suggest that a strongly run flat mile, such as the one he'll face today, could see him to even better effect and with leading rider Jamie Rodriguez, who has an impressive 3-2-0 record from six rides when riding for Ramsey, taking the reins (\$2.33 ROI), 'DOR' could be able to add value to your ticket, especially if playing any vertical wagers.

R11: PAY BILLY (5/2 ML)

PAY BILLY stamped himself as Maryland's top 3-year-old with a standout win in the Private Terms S. last time out, and he now looks to follow up in today's Frederico Tessio S.. Trained by Mike Gorham, this son of IMPROBABLE swooped to the lead with a bold three-wide move on the turn last time before pulling away with energetic strides, winning by a growing 3½ lengths. He seemingly had any amount left to offer, and with paired up Beyer tops of 83, plus an extra 1/16-miles playing to his strengths and a longer run into the first turn enabling a more ground saving trip, he's primed for another career-best effort. Over the last five years, Gorham has gone 14-for-55 (25%; \$2.05 ROI) with dirt routers who won last out and PAY BILLY just keeps getting better. His ceiling is still unknown and he can now book his ticket to Baltimore.
