TODAY'S ANALYSIS - by Dan Illman

)> RACE 1

1. ANOINT 2. INANNA'S QUEST 3. CAIRO STREET

First post is 12:10 ET with low 12% takeout on "Value Pick 5" wagers. **ANOINT** won the last time she was offered for a tag, and seems well-entered after an even performance off a long layoff in a second-level allowance. Broke a beat slow from the fence, raced three wide at the back, dropped inside when one-paced on the second turn, then finished evenly while over in behind rivals. She could use a little pace help to adequately setup her late bid. **INANNA'S QUEST** acted up a bit prior to her seasonal debut, then stayed relatively close to a fast pace in a race won by the deep-closing favorite. The fourth-finisher next ran third in a second-level allowance with a 78 Beyer. Better fit at this class level for barn that went 3 for the last 11 (27%, \$4.89 ROI) second after 180-365 day layoffs. **CAIRO STREET**, listed as a Laurel vet scratch (sick) on 5/26, returns to preferred surface after being wired in a Keeneland heat that produced two next-out winners. That last turf race proved key as well with the fourth-finisher next taking a \$45,000 starter at Delaware with a 75 Beyer. Can get close to the pace for barn that sent out 5-1 turf winner Canadian Bear here on 6/15. PATTY CAKES deserves respect if able to escape the Also Eligible list. WHITE LILACS walked the dog on the lead when beating three of these in circuit debut. She might very well be the fastest from the stalls once again.

⟩⟩ RACE 2

1. REPLY 2. MISCHIEF IN MOTION 3. ROSIEONTHERIVER

REPLY ran well in the Grade 2 Black-Eyed Susan considering it was only her third start, and that she had to endure a long delay prior to the race due to extreme weather conditions. Bumped from midpack early, she found good position near the back behind a fast pace, made an inside bid under urging on the second turn, swung four wide, and finished evenly. The winner next ran second in the Grade 3 Delaware Oaks with a 78 Beyer. Perhaps new blinkers will get her into the race a bit earlier, and we know she has a strong late kick. Conversely, MISCHIEF IN MOTION sheds blinkers after being up close to a solid pace (23.84; 23.51) in a race where stalkers and closers did best. Like to see her back on short rest, and she figures to get the jump on the top pick from tracking range for barn that sent out 5-1 "blinkers on" winner Coringa on 2/8. ROSIEONTHERIVER was wired in a slow-paced race over a speed-friendly Monmouth track. Bumped and pinched back at the start, she pulled while saving ground near the back, made an outside bid under urging, then finished evenly. CLEMENTINE HUNTER, a half-sister to stakes-winning turf router Carnival Colors out of Grade 1-placed dirt router Carnival Court, earned low Beyer in career debut, but she should really appreciate this extra distance, and can grab the early lead.

)> RACE 3

1. MORTAL SIN 2. FIGHTNOMOREFOREVER 3. JUST FOR GIGGLES

MORTAL SIN prepped for this with a fourth-place finish in a 12-furlong point to point race at Old Dominion on April 5. Raced midpack three wide on Laurel turf two back, followed the winner's live cover on the second turn, eased out into the stretch, then changed back to his left lead while second best. Graduated on dirt last time, and should make a late bid swapping out blinkers for cheekpieces. FIGHTNOMOREFOREVER saved ground in midpack behind a fast pace, made a three-wide bid, then flattened out in between in final start of 2024. The runner-up next placed in a \$40,000 "non-two" with a 73 Beyer. Barn sent out 11-10 winner Agent Kelly returning from a six-month layoff on 5/11. JUST FOR GIGGLES received a solid race flow when winning turf

debut. Settled midpack while slightly off the rail, altered course five wide, then got up in the last jump despite being late to change leads. Barn went 4 for the last 12 (33%, \$3.17 ROI) with last-out maiden winners. KUNOOZ deserves strong consideration if able to escape the Also Eligible list. Rodriguez lands here instead of Return Fire. HOMER JONES saved ground in midpack behind a solid pace, split rivals entering far turn, altered outside, then switched back to his left lead late in the game. Think he can get forward in this spot.

)> RACE 4

1. IN MY MEMORIES

2. TUNED TO THE MOON

3. GRAYSON'S GIRL

IN MY MEMORIES, the lone four-time winner in the field, rebounded from four consecutive losses as the favorite to score earlier in the month. Broke in a bit, found a nice spot tracking from off the rail, made a four-wide bid, and got away from them. Versatile running style allows her to adapt to any race flow for barn that went 13 for 35 (37%, \$2.21 ROI) on dirt between 6/2 and 6/17. TUNED TO THE MOON prompted three wide and in between when wired two back, was brushed in between entering the turn, dropped into the pocket, eased out into the stretch and was second best. Part of a three-ply pace dispute last time, and it might have softened her up for top pick's late rally. She might not have as much pressure up front this time for jockey-trainer combo that sent out 10-1 winner On the Mark on 6/6 and 7-2 winner Ginger Girl on 6/14. GRAYSON'S GIRL ran well when wired at Pimlico. Broke a beat slow, didn't seem comfortable racing behind horses on the rail at the back, uncorked a five-wide bid, and finished with interest. She hasn't been good from the gate, however, and might need to stay a bit closer to the pace for barn that went 11 for the last 25 (44%, \$3.32 ROI) third after layoffs between 180 and 365 days in dirt sprints. TIP LINE, listed as a Laurel vet scratch (sick) on 3/8, drops in class and adds Lasix after racing in three stakes. Wired in the Future Stars Fillies, a race where they ran 1-2 around the track, she settled at the back, eased out to split rivals, then finished evenly without threatening. The third-finisher then won Aqueduct's Ruthless Stakes by ten lengths with a 77 Beyer.

)> RACE 5

1. WON AN AWARD

2. HARDSPUN REASON

3. FOREVER SOUPER

WON AN AWARD seemed fresh in first following six-month layoff as he prompted the 17-1 fourth-finisher under confident handling, went on a hard chase on the second turn, then finished evenly with a solid gallop-out. The runner-up next took Monmouth's Cliff Hanger with a 92 Beyer. Think he'll revert to more patient tactics for barn that went 7 for the last 31 (23%, \$3.97 ROI) second after 180-365 day layoffs. Ruiz lands here instead of Wow What Summer. HARDSPUN REASON prevailed following a 233-day freshening for a barn that excels off layoffs, so not that concerned about the 342-day rest leading up to this start. Wired by odds-on Forever Souper in a short field in the Prince George's County last time, he should get a stronger flow to attack. Breezed heads-up outside 3-year-old maiden Astar (58 Beyer) over Fair Hill turf on June 13. FOREVER SOUPER failed as the favorite in his last three, but drops back in with allowance types after just missing in the Cliff Hanger to Otago, who next ran second in the Monmouth Stakes with a 93 Beyer. Tactical sort should sit a nice stalking trip. WOW WHATA SUMMER closed into a strong pace to just miss at Pimlico. The fourth-finisher then ran third in a second-level allowance with an 84 Beyer. Upgrade if there is give in the ground.

)> RACE 6

1. TIDEWATER 2. DETERMINED KINGDOM 3. CRABS N BEER

TIDEWATER just missed in last year's Ben's Cat after carving out the fractions in a race where the pace held together, and he got a bit too far back in his most recent start at Pimlico. Altered course to the outside in the stretch and ran on with energy at that five-eighths trip. The fifth-finisher then took a second-level allowance with an 89 Beyer. Might be set for best in third start of the year for barn that sent out 10-1 winner Toast to Coast on 6/15.

DETERMINED KINGDOM also goes third off the layoff after a late-running try at Pimlico. Purchased for \$190,000 at Keeneland last fall, he couldn't get as close to the pace as usual after being bumped at the start, but showed an improved kick from his prior start. With an alert break, he should be prominent from the opening bell. CRABS N BEER hasn't sprinted in almost three years, but he won three sprints early in his career. Probably in a bit tough in the Grade 3 Dinner Party over a wet turf course at Pimlico, but likely reverts to late-running tactics dropping in class and distance.

⟩⟩ RACE 7

1. INVEIGLED 2. AIN'T DA BEER COLD 3. CADET CORPS

INVEIGLED repeats the "Lasix On" angle that resulted in his seasonal debut victory. Ran well in the restricted Knicks Go at Churchill last time as he hooked up in a solid pace battle (22.42, 22.78) with the 27-1 eighth-finisher, and was the only part of the pace sticking around at the end. His pace rival returned to finish second in a high-level Churchill allowance with a 94 Beyer. Might not have to work as hard to get forward in this spot. **AIN'T DA BEER COLD** hasn't finished ahead of another horse in his last five races, but he has a ton of back class as well as the early speed to get on or near the lead.

Think this winter break might have done him a world of good, and he's another one getting Lasix once again. **CADET CORPS** saved ground at the back behind a quick pace at Delaware, split rivals on the far turn under urging, squeezed through a seam in upper stretch, then drove home to score in a race dominated by closers. He should get a fair pace to attack from near the back of the field.

⟩⟩ RACE 8

1. BOSSERATI 2. ALLA BREVE 3. CUT FROM CLASS

BOSSERATI must navigate six furlongs, but she looks like the controlling speed, and usually displays grit and determination in the stretch. She was ready to roll in the The Very One as she set a pressured pace inside the 3-1 runner-up, then refused to yield despite drifting out and hopping back to her left lead. Beat two next-out winners and handles any kind of ground. Perhaps ALLA BREVE has the top one's number as she beat her in last year's Jameela, and finished ahead of her in the Pan Zareta at Fair Grounds. Don't think she had the best trip in the latter race as she broke a beat slow, stalked in between, was steadied entering the turn, eased outside, and changed back to her left lead while in between. Kicks on in the late stages. She won off a 153-day layoff last year, so perhaps she won't be rusty coming back following this 203-day break. CUT FROM CLASS turns back in distance, but she's won sprinting. Settled for pocket position in the Dahlia, eased off the rail when likely beaten, and finished in a one-paced fashion. Think she can adapt to any race scenario. HOLLYWOOD WALK might have been compromised when wired in the slow-paced License Fee last month. Saved ground in the pocket, then finished evenly behind the two pacesetters. Good fit against restricted competition.

1. TEDDY'S LUCKY GIRL

2. THIRD TUESDAY

3. TAMMY'S MAGIC

TEDDY'S LUCKY GIRL brings dirtied-up form into today's finale. Raced wide over a rail-friendly track in debut, caught a muddy strip against tougher \$45,000 waiver maidens at Pimlico, then might not have cared for two-turn turf racing two weeks later. Didn't break the best in that wet-track event, was outrun while saving ground and failed to menace. The winner next ran third in a \$40,000 "non-two" seller with a 48 Beyer. Barn went 3 for the last 10 (30%, \$3.16 ROI) with experienced maidens adding blinkers for the first time. THIRD TUESDAY also returns to dirt after being beaten double-digits on the lawn. Perhaps a bit uncomfortable in between in the early stages of dirt start two back, she made a three-wide bid before finishing behind two sharp favorites. The winner repeated in a dime "non-two" claimer with a 50 Beyer. TAMMY'S MAGIC has excuses for her lone dirt start as she was wired by odds-on Margarita Daze in her first run after 262 days on the sidelines. The runner-up then finished third in a quarter maiden at Penn National with a 49 Beyer. BELLA CATTIVA (\$24,000 RNA May juvenile; \$5,000 June juvenile) breezed two furlongs in 22 flat at the June auction, and is a half-sister to multiple stakes-placed sprinter Had to Have Him (90 dirt Beyer). GREAT MOON is very well-entered after being wired in his debut at Charles Town. AUTHENTICATED might not have cared for turf or wet-dirt in her last four starts. Wired on dirt two back, but has solid-enough starts on fast going.

KALI'S KEY – by Kali Francois

Race 3 - #1 Just For Giggles and #5 Homer Jones

Giving you either an exacta box or two solid horses to open the first leg of the Middle Pick Four sequence that we have going on for Saturday. With us seeing a different individual in terms of the #1 Just for Giggles, Magee second time on the turf is going to be a stat that will be climbing over the summer and autumn this year. The presumed favorite of the race, #5 Homer Jones with Trombetta in about to cycle in good form - as an individual, he's great 3rd off the layoff. Coming down to the sixteen level helps a little as well.

MACK'S FACTS - by Mackenzie Pfeiffer

R1: 2nd off the bench and Boyce back on looks to benefit Inanna's Quest much more here today. Going the mile she will likely sit close to the pace and may keep things honest against the controlling speed in White Lilacs.

R2: Reply adds blinkers and comes out of a trying effort in the Black Eyed Susan, she looks ready to step forward here. Interesting 2nd time starter in Clementine Hunter, the pedigree certainly indicates she may appreciate the added ground.

R3: I find this a tricky race to handicap, ultimately landing with Just for Giggles after the impressive maiden score first on the turf. Severn Run has all the reason to improve when trying the grass here.

R4: In My Memories has answered nearly every question and seems the logical play here, some concern if she can hang on for the 3/4 distance with this group. Conquerthosewecan was quick enough as a 2 y/o on debut to place in MSW company, she may need a race back but could benefit from an honest pace to close into.

R5: Kake's Arrow has everything working in his favor when cutting back to the mile, I still try to beat him with Eff Thirty Five who arrives off of a freshening. Suspect the pace will be kept plenty honest here today.

R6: Super competitive group of veteran turf sprinters, I take a price in King Covee who looks to appreciate the 3/4 distance on the grass. Keep an eye on Tidewater, he has plenty of reason to run his best race 2nd time on the grass this year.

R7: Cadet Corps found trouble 2 back but really impressed when running second to Point Dume, he seems the best play to beat a potentially short priced favorite. Be Better seems to be coming into his better form, which may be enough get a handle on this group.

R8: Alla Breve has always dazzled and you rarely need to make an excuse for her. She may need to step up first off the bench but we have seen it before. Bosserati is full of confidence and looks to be tough in here again, we'll see if the 3/4 distance gives room for foes to catch her.

R9: Third Tuesday has been improving while sticking to this level, I excuse the turf try with a trouble trip and suspect she is forwardly placed here. Keep an eye on debut runner Bella Cattiva, a half sibling to Had to Have Him.

Race 6: The Ben's Cat Stakes (Restricted), 3YO+, 6F, Turf

| HORSE | RACE | TRIP NOTE |

| CRABS N BEER | Dinner Party S., Pim, 1 1/8M, Good, 05/17/25 – 7th | 'CNB' was not rushed having broken from the two hole but still managed to adopt a favorable rail stalking position early, ~1L off the slow pace. He traveled keenly in this position to ~1/2M pole, then eased into the 2P to avoid the retreating leader heading into the far turn. As the pace then quickened in front, he became outpaced & dropped back slightly while under pressure on the bend, hitting the top of the lane ~3L down & heading in the wrong direction. From there, he faded further in the stretch. This was a high-quality field he was taking on; however, having established a perfect position behind the slow pace early, he then became badly outpaced when the real running began which wasn't ideal considering he's cutting back to 6F today. Trip is likely to be an issue today. |
| KING COVEE | SA, BAQ, 6F, Firm, 06/12/25 – 2nd | 'KC' broke okay from gate two, then took a minor bump after the break but wasn't drastically impeded. He lacked speed initially out the gate & raced towards rear through the opening furlong but then advanced under a tight hold to adopt a favorable tracking position in mid-pack, ~2L off the slow pace while racing in the 2P to the 5/16 pole. He was then angled out into the clear 4W & advanced smoothly around horses to take a share of 2 nd at the top of the stretch with the lone leader in sight. From there, he came under a strong ride & finished strongly to the wire but was never catching the winner. Another solid effort in defeat: he traveled well in mid-pack, advanced smoothly in the 3-4P on the bend, then finished powerfully but could not reach the gate to wire winner who had gotten away with setting a slow pace eagerly. He again showed a good attitude & could have more to offer again as he makes his third start of the form cycle, especially if given a stronger pace to run at. |
| SINETIC | MD Alw, Pim, 5F, Firm, 05/10/25 – 7th | Having broken alertly from the rail, SINETIC was ridden forward & showed good speed to vie for the lead early. He traveled well dueling through sharp fractions to the top of the stretch, then came under a strong ride & gamely maintained the lead to ~50yds before the 1/8 th pole. However, he then became leg weary, was engulfed by the closers & faded back into 7 th . Went hard dueling from the rail, then faded. He showed a good attitude here; however, this is a much tougher group that he faces today, he's not going to be alone on the lead, & he'll also have to last another furlong if he's to score, which seems unlikely. Needs more. |
| GREAT IDEA | Alw, Lrl, 5 1/2F, Firm, 05/15/25 – 3rd | Following a clean break, 'GI' came under pressure to keep up when outpaced chasing the blistering pace to the far turn, ~5L back in the 2P. He then found his stride & traveled better when riding the rail around the far turn but didn't advance & hit the top of the stretch still ~7L behind. However, he then tipped out into the clear 4W, came under a strong ride & rallied nicely through the lane for a fast-closing 3rd. He was never reaching the winner though. Clean trip. Was outpaced chasing the red-hot pace early, then rallied powerfully in the stretch. Was possibly flattered by the pace scenario but still, this was a decent enough effort. If he shows back up today to make his third start of the form cycle off just a 6-day break, the stretch out to 6F should suit him. Promising. |
| TIDEWATER | Alw, Pim, 5F, Good, 05/16/25 – 3rd | TIDEWATER was restrained from the gate & dropped back to chase the pace in rear, ~10L off the pace racing to the far turn. He remained patiently handled in this position to ~1/4 pole, then worked out into the centre of the track at the top of the stretch, came under a strong ride & finished gamely to the wire, passing multiple rivals to claim 3rd. He lacked the pace to threaten for the win though. Was very patiently handled far off the pace, then finished with interest but lacked the pace to challenge for the win. The pace fell apart a little here, which slightly flattered him; however, he there's no denying that he showed a likable attitude & ran in a manner to suggest that, as he now makes his third start of the form cycle, he can improve today for the extra yardage. He also stumbled a few times on the 'good' listed turf and may have more to offer if the ground comes up firm today. |
| HAD TO HAVE HIM | Alw, Lrl, 5 1/2F, Good, 05/31/25 – 1st | (Off turf event). 'HTHH' broke alertly from the rail but didn't want any part of the early pace & eased back to stalk the pace in last, ~1L off the lead early. He traveled well in this position to ~5/16 pole, then gradually eased his way off the rail into the clear 3-4W ~1/4 pole. From there, he steadily advanced around horses, drew level for the lead while still under a hand ride ~1/8 th pole, then came under a strong ride & extended away for a comfortable score. Four runner race. This was a convincing win off the layoff: he powerfully stalked the pace, then eased out, advanced under hand urging, drew level ~1/8 th pole & extended away nicely late. He won in a manner that suggested 6F could see him to even better effect & he could strip fitter today too. Promising. |
| HUNTER JOE | Alw, Lrl, 5 1/2F, Good, 06/01/25 – 4th | (Off turf event). Following a clean break, 'HJ' tracked the leaders while being squeezed along between horses in the 3P, ~1L back heading to the far turn. Under a hand ride, he then advanced in the 3P to be racing just a neck behind the pace setters ~1/4 pole. He then came under a stronger ride but could find no more & despite trying hard, faded into last. Sat 3W throughout which maybe cost him a length or two, but not the win. He was under pressure to stick within striking range throughout but could find no more late on & faded. He's entitled to strip fitter for this comeback run & should improve for both the stretch out to 6F & return to turf; however, it would still have been nice to have seen a little more from him here & improvement will be required. |

| DETERMINED | Jim McKay Turf | 'DK' took a bump & was forced in slightly at the break which left him chasing the place at the rear of the body of the field, ~5L off the pace early. He was |

| KINGDOM | Sprint S., Pim, 5F, Good, 05/17/25 – 3rd | patiently ridden in this position to ~5/16 pole, then received a nudge from his rider & advanced slightly along the rail to hit the top of the stretch ~3L down. From there, he came under a strong ride & responded nicely to draw level for the lead ~1/16 pole. However, as the winner then blew by everyone down the centre, his forward momentum flattened out slightly & he had to settle for 3 rd . This was a good effort in defeat against talented horses. Having been impeded at the gate, he had to work hard to draw level for the lead ~1/16 pole which, on the 'good' listed turf, possibly explains him flattening out slightly late. Facing slightly easier company today, if granted a cleaner break, he could improve again & be very dangerous as he makes his third start of the form cycle, especially if the turf is firm. |
| WHENIGETTOHEAVEN | Alw, PID, 6F, Synth, 06/04/25 – 3rd | WHENIGETTOHEAVEN broke okay from the rail, then worked forward to stalk the pace under a tight hold in the pocket, ~1L off the lead early. He traveled well in this position to ~1/4 pole, then found room, came under a strong ride & stayed on well to the wire but lacked the pace to challenge the 7/5 winner who had set slow fractions in front from the start & kicked powerfully off the bend. He eventually dead heated for 3 rd , just 1/2L off 2 nd . Despite the defeat, this wasn't a terrible effort as he was bottled up behind slow fractions set by the 7/5 favorite from the start which made it hard for him to close late. He did travel well though, show a good attitude & stay on well to the wire. Now returning to the turf with a wide draw in his third start of the form cycle, he can improve. |
| TALL ORDER | Alw, Pim, 5F, Good, 05/16/25 – 7th | Having broken cleanly from gate two, 'TO' was restrained back to chase the pace in rear, ~9L off the pace racing to the far turn. He didn't have to check, but he did have to alter course slightly out into the 5P. From there, when clear, he came under a strong ride & stayed on well enough to the wire; however, he lacked a finishing punch & never threatened for the win. He didn't have a completely clean stretch run here, but it didn't really cost him a position & he didn't have much of an excuse. He'll need much more today taking on tougher company. |

This was a solid score off the layoff. Horses to Follow

R6: WHENIGETTOHEAVEN (5/2 ML)

WHENIGETTOHEAVEN appears well-positioned to defend his title in this afternoon's Bens Cat S., despite a lack of recent wins. The 6-year-old gelded son of STREET MAGICIAN has gone winless in six starts since narrowly defeating the re-opposing TIDEWATER in this race last year, and he hasn't yet matched the 89 Beyer he posted in that victory. Still, his two starts this year show he retains a high level of ability. After a 119-day layoff, he returned to finish a strong third in the King T. Leatherbury S. behind FORE HARP and WITTY (the latter won the Jim McKay Turf Sprint S. with a 94 Beyer next out), despite having been caught in a tough spot pressing the hot pace between rivals early on. Then, in his most recent outing over Presque Isle's synthetic surface, he again finished a game third, even though that race didn't set up well for him at all, as he found himself boxed in behind slow fractions on the rail, which made catching the 7/5 favorite - who wired the field - nearly impossible. Owing to his lack of match fitness two back and the poor set up he received last time, it's easy to envisage him taking a big step forward this afternoon and recapturing his best form as he makes his third start of the form cycle. Not only does he get back to sprinting 6-furlongs on the turf at Laurel Park, where he clearly thrives, but he also draws perfectly towards the outside, from where he can adopt a favorable stalking position in what's likely to be a moderately paced affair, and reunites with jockey Torrealba, who has ridden him in all his top-three Beyer earning efforts. Furthermore, over the the last four weeks, trainer Nolan Ramsey's runners have produced five wins, three seconds, and two thirds from just twelve starts (42%-win rate, 83% in-the-money, \$2.03 ROI), strengthening his case. He comes into this contest as one of the fastest, most hard-trying horses in the line up, has already beaten most of today's rivals, and despite his recent losses, looks set to become the first repeat winner of the race since Ben's Cat hi

R8: BOSSERATI (5/2 ML)

Like the Ben's Cat S., this afternoon's Jameela S. lacks early speed, which could compromise the 2/1 morning-line favorite ALLA BREVE and instead, leave the door ajar for BOSSERATI to notch a second straight stakes victory and put her tough beat in this race last year behind her. Trained by Brittany Russell, the daughter of HOLY BOSS was last seen determinedly scoring in Pimlico's The Very One Stakes, where she broke sharply, seized the lead early, and set a pressured pace before digging deep to hold on by a neck at the wire. Concerns linger about her ability to stretch out an extra furlong today, given she just only just clung on in that 5-furlong battle. However, context matters: she faced constant pressure on the front end that day, was returning from a 167-day layoff, and ran on a 'good' listed turf course described by jockeys as "sticky and holding." Today, on paper at least, it appears that she'll enjoy an easier time of things dictating terms up front, and with that extra race fitness now behind her, plus a firmer turf course playing in her favor, there's a strong chance that she can go all the way again for the red-hot Russell barn, who have started the meet hitting at a staggering 35% clip (11-for-35).

R9: THIRD TUESDAY (4/1 ML)

Look past THIRD TUESDAY's most recent effort when she was significantly hampered just over a furlong into what was her turf debut, and a strong case for her in today's nightcap. Two back, the 4-year-old daughter of GREAT NOTION, now trained by Jonathan Maldonado, posted a 32 Beyer with a strong third place finish over today's course and distance, beaten just 3 1/2-lengths by SHE'S A GEM and PAPERBACK EDITION, both of whom returned to score next out with Beyers of 51 and 40, respectively. However, that race didn't come without mishap either, as she stumbled at the start, then checked entering the turn before getting caught four wide. All things considered, she did exceptionally well to finish as close as she did. Now returning to the dirt, if returning to a similar or improved level of form than she showed that day, she could make her 4/1 odds look very generous in this weaker looking contest with apprentice rider Matilda Burnham taking a valuable 7lbs off.

Trainer: Carlos Mancilla **Last Race:** Mar. 21, 5th **Finish:** 6th by 13 3/4

Tracked in between rivals, dropped down to the pocket on the turn, then failed to threaten a pace-pressing runaway winner over a speed-friendly track. Perhaps he needs weaker company, so he's worth a follow at the dime maiden level here, or against nickel sellers at Charles Town.

MUSGRAVE

Trainer: Phil Capuano Last Race: May 25, 8th

Finish: 4th by 7

Improved speed first-Lasix and first-time gelding off the claim. Against the grain when battling inside foes, he stayed willingly past mid stretch. Given a fair surface, graduation day could be in order in the near future.

LEVISA

Trainer: Richard Sillaman Last Race: April 4, 8th

OURDAYDREAMINGGIRL (Breezed 4F - 48.56 at PRX on 6/6)

Trainer: Lou Linder Last Race: Feb. 22, 7th Finish: 4th by 2 1/2

Steadied in opening stages of the Wide Country Stakes, angled out six wide entering the stretch, then closed willingly while drifting out.

PACO THE TACO MAN

Trainer: John Salzman Jr. Last Race: May 31, 6th Finish: 1st by 1 3/4

Returned in a big way as a first-time gelding for Salzman Jr. Confidently handled around the turn, altered off heels in upper stretch and surged clear of the heavy fave posting a 90 Beyer in the off-turf affair. Had been waiting for him on the lawn, but this race stamps him as a force on either surface moving forward.

THIS IS GOOD
