TODAY'S ANALYSIS - by Dan Illman

)> RACE 1

1. POLECAT 2. DEVILISH ONE 3. CENTSAMILLA

First post is noon with a LOW 12% takeout on "Value Pick 5" wagers. **POLECAT** double-drops into this strict "non-two" claimer after facing Pam Pam, who then earned her fifth victory in a \$20,000 starter-optional here with a 72 Beyer. Broke in a bit and bumped a foe, prompted a three-ply pace from the fence, tired on the second turn, and never threatened. Cuts back in distance with the tactical speed to sit a nice stalking trip for a barn that went 5 for the last 19 (26%, \$2.51 ROI) in the first after a trainer switch. **DEVILISH ONE** looks like the one to catch and beat after wiring maidens in her first run after a 132-day layoff. Barn went 3-for-14 (21%, \$3.01 ROI) with last-out maidens in the first start following layoffs of 61 days or more. **CENTSAMILLA** set legitimate fractions of 23.29 and 23.71 before faltering at seven furlongs. Should appreciate cutting back to three-quarters, and figures close to the pace for a barn that went 8 for the last 19 (44%, \$4.89 ROI) in the third start after a 61-day layoff or greater on dirt.

⟩⟩ RACE 2

1. GENIEINABRIDLE 2. RIBBONSINHERHAIR 3. MORE RANSOM

GENIEINABRIDLE seeks a fourth consecutive victory and has the speed to set up shop from close to the pace. Set a three-ply pace from the rail on Halloween, was pushed by the 7-2 runner-up after a half-mile, then stayed strong in the stretch. Acts like the extra distance won't pose too much of an issue. RIBBONSINHERHAIR couldn't get past the top pick, but rebounded 27 days later over "good" going. Tracked from the pocket, eased around a tiring foe, then took advantage of a significant opening on the inside before running up the score. Expect her to sit just off the leaders while saving valuable ground. Uncoupled mate MORE RANSOM stretches out in distance after being wired at Penn National. The fourth-finisher returned to win there on Thursday evening. She should show more speed for a barn that went 4 for 11 (36%, \$2.65 ROI) with runners moving from sprint to route.

)> RACE 3

1. READY FOR MAGIC 2. SWEET HONEY BEE 3. KISSED AT DAWN

READY FOR MAGIC prompted the pace from the rail, then finished evenly behind the two favorites. Dips in class, and can work out a nice tracking trip while outside and clear of traffic. **SWEET HONEY BEE** finished ahead of three of these last month after rallying four wide into second. She's found her proper class level on dirt and can adapt to any race flow. **KISSED AT DAWN** pushed a solid pace before tiring at Penn National. The fourth-finisher then ran third in a nickel "non-three" life with a 43 Beyer. Drops back down into a strict "non-two" claimer for a barn that sent out a 7-1 winner at Penn National on 11/20. Mena departs for WAMPY.

1. DON'T WAIT UP 2. GOODBYE NOTE 3. MISTER LINCOLN

DON'T WAIT UP prompted the pace three wide over a closer-friendly track, attacked the leader three-two wide under urging, then stayed gamely for second to favored Mosler Time. Must avoid being outrun early as he cuts back in distance for a barn that went 4 for the last 12 (33%, \$2.27 ROI) with horses returning in two weeks or less. **GOODBYE NOTE** cleared off to set an uncontested pace, came off the rail, then hopped back to his left lead when tiring. The winner of that heat then ran third in a second-level allowance with a 79 Beyer. Likely reverts to stalking tactics for a barn that sent out route-to-sprint winner Fabia on 11/1. **MISTER LINCOLN** woke up in recent turf starts, but he's plenty capable on dirt. Stalked in between in his most recent dirt appearance, was hard-ridden to stalk three wide and in between, then failed to threaten. The barn went 7 for the last 26 (27%, \$2.05 ROI) with horses moving from turf to dirt while returning in two weeks or less. BOB MARCO drops in class and should show speed in the first start following a 415-day break. Faced two next-out winners last time, and the runner-up then ran third in a high-level allowance with an 89 Beyer. Wonder if he's using this as a prep for something longer. TALKLESSWORKMORE went too fast (23.51, 23.73) in the recent two-turn heat, yet still held nicely for third. The runner-up then ran third in a \$20,000 starter with a 74 Beyer.

⟩⟩ RACE 5

1. BEACHES AND PEARLS 2. ADE

3. CANADIAN BEAR

There's a good chance that **BEACHES AND PEARLS** is dressed up after that 17 1/4 length victory. She seems to move forward on wet tracks, and the competition at Mountaineer that evening was very weak (six next-out runners; none hit the board; 27 best Beyer). Stalked off the rail, tracked two wide/four path, attacked from the three path, and took over at the five-sixteenths, then scored in "ridden out" fashion. A repeat of that Beyer makes her tough, but ask for value as she still has lots of questions to answer. Barn went 9 for the last 35 (26%, \$2.95 ROI) with last-out winners. **ADE** wheels back on short notice after chasing favored Synergism. Mena departs for Why Not Grace. **CANADIAN BEAR** overcame a slow pace to dominate a weaker group at Penn National. Barn went 4 for 17 (24%, \$2.18 ROI) between 11/21 and 12/4. Rodriguez departs for ANOTHERHOPE.

)> RACE 6

1. STRONG LIKE SARA

2. DELRAY

3. KILO ROAD

STRONG LIKE SARA set a pressured pace inside the 18-1 runner-up on dirt at Oaklawn two back, poked a head in front, then tired in the final sixteenth. The winner of that heat then hit the board in two stakes with a 71 Beyer top. Don't think she really cares for turf, so not putting much stock in the most recent effort. The 175-day layoff is concerning as she catches a challenging field, but the barn went 4 for the last 12 (33%, \$2.23 ROI) with runners moving from turf to dirt. DELRAY also returns from a long layoff after being overmatched in the Grade 3 Miss Preakness. Faced two next-out winners in that spot with Echo Sound repeating in the Grade 3 Victory Ride at Saratoga with a 101 Beyer. Unbeaten from two starts with Lasix, she'll get the medication again.

KILO ROAD ran well to place in her first off a short layoff despite failing to change leads. Might have to rally from farther out of it at this shorter sprint trip. HOWLER set a fast pace at Delaware last time and looks like the main speed once again. MYSTIC SEAPORT seems equally adept on dirt and turf, and fits well at this class level. Faced Carmelina in the most recent dirt appearance, and that one won two of her next three starts with a 95 Beyer top.

)> RACE 7

1. MISS FULTON GAL

2. LAW SCHOOL

3. GOD I NEED A FAVOR

MISS FULTON GAL tracked from in between rivals, found the pocket at the half-mile pole, eased out to split foes three wide into the stretch, then stayed on for second behind a wide-rallying winner. Hoping she can get more forwardly placed after breaking from a challenging outside post position. LAW SCHOOL pressed the 10-1 last-finisher, took over the lead in the stretch, then couldn't fend off the top pick. That was a reasonable effort considering the work she did in the early stages, and she might have an easier time getting to the front for a barn that went 25 for 75 (33%, \$2.04 ROI) between 11/16 and 12/4. Chuan lands here instead of Astrid. GOD I NEED A FAVOR took advantage of a closer-friendly track when rallying into second in a race where the top-two finishers were last and next-to-last after the opening quarter. Repeats the sprint to route move that propelled her to that maiden score two back.

)> RACE 8

1. BAY WEST 2. WATCH ME SPARKLE 3. DISNEY BELLE

BAY WEST can build off a decent debut. Bumped at the start, she raced three wide and in between at the back behind quick fractions, made an inside bid on the turn, eased out to split foes, then finished evenly with a promising gallop-out. The third-finisher then placed in a special weight with a 62 Beyer. Expect good tactical speed for a barn that went 7 for the last 19 (37%, \$3.23 ROI) with runners moving from maiden special to maiden claiming. WATCH ME SPARKLE broke slowly, then found a good position at the back behind a quick pace. Made a four-wide bid on the turn under urging, drifted inward in the stretch, and tried hard for second. The winner of that heat then placed in a quarter claimer with a 48 Beyer. Expect more speed and focus for a barn that went 7 for 22 (32%, \$4.57 ROI) on dirt between 11/1 and 11/30. DISNEY BELLE pushed a fast pace while four wide, tapered inward to track in between, was urged along on the turn, altered course to the fence, and was game to snag third. Don't be surprised if she shows good speed. HONOR OUR COUNTRY drops in class after facing Prosecco Rita, who returned to place in the Smart Halo Stakes with a 72 Beyer.

KALI'S KEYS – by Kali Francois

Strike Gold?

Race 4: #5 Bob Marco - 8/1

Other than the fact I'm a fan of the horse, I'm not afraid of a 415-day layoff from the Magee barn. You know what his game is going to be and class wise, he's the likeliest candidate for being the speed. He's been inconsistent coming off from a layoff, but other than his first start when he was with Pletcher, this is the biggest span of works leading up to a race - which means he's ready to go. If not, he'll just need one race I think.

All or...Nothing?

Race 6: #1 Howler - 6/1

Russell will have no problem with the likely favorite in Mystic Seaport getting back to the dirt. I have Howler as an all or nothing type, capable of doing so with her consistent quickness in the first 1/8th of the race. For a 5.5 effort, she can easily dictate the race as I think she has the potential to be faster than anybody in here. Every now and then when she takes on a challenger, she'll dig in, which is why I'm dubious as all or nothing type.

MACK'S FACTS – by Mackenzie Pfeiffer

R1: Ariel Moon benefits from class relief while returning to the dirt, where her figures seem to stack up well against this group. A possible pace duel up front may set things up for her late bid. Devilish One looks the one to beat but may have a hard time stealing the show while stretching out.

R2: While none of the runners in this group have tried this distance on the dirt, Genieinabridle continues improving with added ground and should be able to sit the trip here. Isabella's Glory looks to improve as well and may benefit from a pace collapse, look to her for a price if things heat up.

R3: Sweet Honey Bee made a convincing effort last out while taking class relief and caught wide. Reason to believe she works a tidier trip here and may be able to clear early. Keep an eye on Wampy, she found herself trying winners this spring against very in form and improving types. The freshening may serve her well.

R4: Tiz No Clown returns from over 1 year layoff and may benefit from a lack of sprinter speed and his inside post. The bullet work on 10/22 suggests he should pickup where he left off. Don't Wait Up shortens up in distance after troubled trips, he is proven over the distance and looks to be back in strong form.

R5: Anotherhope looks to stretch out for the first time since finding this level, previous efforts are encouraging and the run style fits. She should benefit from a pace setup in which the ML favorite Got Game (9-5) will likely be involved. While Got Game looks to benefit from class relief and a clean trip, she tends to prefer being the lone pace.

R6: Delray should appreciate stepping back into racing with Lasix back on and class relief, last seen in G3 company this past May. Her tactical speed will be advantageous against this group. There is a possibility for a Servis exacta if Strong Like Sara returns with her high cruising speed, Lasix back on should help.

R7: Astrid has to improve while stepping up in company but the pedigree suggests she just needed the added ground to graduate last out. Note, the half sibling Tap for Luck (Tapit) was a graded stakes placed dirt router. Miss Fulton Gal certainly brings the class experience and may continue improving now that she has 2 routing efforts under her. The last out was a winning effort until she was run down by a late flying closer.

R8: Watch Me Sparkle steps up in class after a competitive debut rallying from off the pace, pedigree suggests the added ground will benefit here. Bay West didn't impress on debut but the messy trip and sprinting distance could be to blame. I give her a second chance, try to demand a bit of value.

INCISIVE KITTEN

Trainer: Mike Trombetta **Last Race:** Sept. 7, 5th race

Finish: 7th by 5 1/4

Late-running filly needs pace help, and she didn't get it here as they ran 1-2-3-4-5 around the track after glacial fractions of 25.18, 50.31 and 1:15.47. Wound up last and in between horses on the second turn before finishing evenly on the fence. Hoping to catch a field with lots of speed influences, likely in a \$12,500 "non-two" turf event.

BRAMBLE BLAST (Breezed 4F – 48.80 at TAM on 11/18)

Trainer: Mike Dini

Last Race: Oct. 25, 6th Race

Finish: 6th by 2

Expected to be one of the speeds, she was sandwiched and steadied back to last leaving the gate, then saved ground near the back entering the turn. Completely stymied in behind horses on the rail for most of the stretch, she showed some run once clear, and galloped out very nicely. Juvenile filly might show up sprinting on turf in Florida.

BIG BOLTON (*Breezed 4F – 49.60 at LRL on 11/28*)

Trainer: Milan Milosevic **Last Race**: Nov. 8, 3rd race

Finish: 1st by 2 1/4

Holy Boss gelding showed a nice work tab leading up to his debut, then rushed up to push the 6-1 ninth-finisher's early pace. Took over turning into the stretch, then finished the job nicely. Curious

to see where he heads next.

GALATINA

Trainer: Keri Brion (Breezed 4F – 48.80 at FG on 11/29)

Last Race: Nov. 7, Race 8

Finish: 4th by 3 1/2

Nothing went right for this filly when the beaten favorite. Pulled hard while saving ground in midpack, was stuck behind a 67-1 dullard and wound up last on the rail turning for home, was blocked in upper stretch, then came

Sent up between horses early through a white-hot first quarter, then continued to duel through a strong half, tiring in the final sixteenth. Tab

NOLA BOSS

Trainer: Brittany Russell **Last Race:** Nov. 1, 11th race **Finish:** 3rd by 8 1/4 lengths

Ridden aggressively leaving the gate, he pressed the favored pacesetter through a quick opening quarter in 22.08 seconds. Put that horse away he finished last - at the five-sixteenths pole, then eventually tired from his early efforts. He has excellent tactical speed and fits well at the

\$16,000 "non-three" claiming level.

Gun Runner filly sold for a million dollars as a yearling, and was a professional debut winner. Pinched a bit at the start, recovered to track the pace outside, then ran by the odds-on favorite in the stretch. Expect

her to winter at Tampa Bay Downs.

NOLA BOSS

Trainer: Brittany Russell Last Race: Nov. 1, 11th race Finish: 3rd by 8 1/4 lengths

Ridden aggressively leaving the gate, he pressed the favored pacesetter through a quick opening quarter in 22.08 seconds. Put that horse away he finished last - at the five-sixteenths pole, then eventually tired from

with a nice run once altered into the clear. She fits at the \$45,000 maiden claiming level, but is running out of time with turf season about to end.

MISS FULTON GAL (Entered TODAY at Laurel - Race 7)

Trainer: Mike Gorham **Last Race:** Nov. 15; 5th race

Finish: 2nd by 3

Juvenile filly gave a solid effort against first-level allowance competition over a one-turn mile. Tracked in between horses on the backstretch, found the pocket entering the bend, split rivals turning into the long straight, and finished willingly. Seems versatile enough to perform well as a late-running sprinter or a two-turn distance horse.

BETTER WATCH IT

Trainer: Madison Meyers **Last Race:** Nov. 16, 1st race

Finish: 5th by 9

Sent off the favorite in a "non-two" starter allowance, he was bumped at the start and steadied in behind horses heading into the first turn. That left him saving ground in midpack behind a glacial opening quarter in 25.15. By the time he got a seam in the upper stretch, the runaway winner was long gone.

WICKEDDIVINE

Trainer: Kenny Cox Last Race: Nov. 30, 4th Finish: 2nd by 1 1/4

Makes the list again after almost pulling off a 15-1 upset as a "Horse to Watch" prospect. Broke from the rail in a state-sired allowance, battled with two foes during the opening quarter mile, was shuffled back slightly along the fence on the turn, altered course to the far outside in the midstretch, and came with a determined run to place behind the favorite. Don't think he was comfortable racing down inside, and deserves another look with a wider post position.

THUNDER IN PARIS

Trainer: Anthony Farrior **Last Race:** Nov. 16; 5th race

Finish: 9th by 23 1/4

his early efforts. He has excellent tactical speed and fits well at the \$16,000 "non-three" claiming level.

SUPERLASTINGSECRET

Trainer: Damon Dilodovico **Last Race:** Nov. 30, 6th race

Finish: 2nd by 2 1/4

Broke sharp, and chased a lone pacesetter through a quick opening quarter. Inhaled that foe on the turn, made the lead, and understandably tired in the final furlong. He did a good amount of work in the early stages and is dangerous right back as the controlling speed for the \$12,500 maiden claiming level.

FLYING TO WORK

Trainer: Kieron Magee **Last Race:** Nov. 30, 5th race

Finish: 4th by 12 3/4

Broke slowly in his debut, then was pinched back shortly after the break. Fell far behind under a 10-pound bug rider, cut the corner into the stretch, then made up some late ground on the fence. Claimed out of that race, he fits at the \$16,000 maiden claiming level.

PONT AVEN

Trainer: Phil Capuano **Last Race:** Nov. 29, 3rd Race

Finish: 4th by 5 3/4

A second-time starting juvenile, Pont Aven went to his knees at the start, then pulled his way along to race three wide and in between horses at the back of the pack. Advanced along the inside at the three-eighths pole, angled three wide at the five-sixteenths, eased four deep turning for home, then understandably flattened out late. He'll show speed next time, given an alert break.

STANZA

Trainer: Elizabeth Merryman **Last Race:** Nov. 22, 9th race

Finish: 3rd by 7

Lost her footing at the start, then raced four wide/six path at the back in a race won in gate-to-wire fashion. The running line looks awful, but she was claimed by a barn that has options here or out of town.

SOCIETY BALL

Trainer: Jamie Ness

Last Race: Nov. 29, 4th race **Finish:** dead-heat for 5th by 8

Broke slowly, then was pinched back in the opening sixteenth of a mile. Checked and lost momentum at the three-eighths pole, swung six wide into the stretch, and finished evenly. While this filly has a habit of breaking badly, this trip still wasn't good at all. She's effective at distances ranging from six furlongs to a mile.

MAXPOWER

Trainer: Claudio Gonzalez **Last Race:** Nov. 29, 6th race

Finish: 7th by 14 1/2

Outrun in the early stages of a \$16,000 maiden claimer, this 2-yearold was three wide and in between horses on the turn, then finished deceptively well while being over in behind horses in the stretch. This is a sprint family, but he might move up with more distance. Trouble-prone gelding's luck didn't change in main track debut. Sandwiched at the start, he was last on the backstretch before angling four wide into the lane. Ran on with some interest over that muddy track, and deserves another chance against state-sired maiden company.

EL DIVINO NINO

Trainer: Rodolfo Sanchez-Salomon

Last Race: Nov. 29, 9th race

Finish: 2nd by 1

Ridden aggressively from the gate, he pushed the pace from the outside, opened up a clear advantage on the turn, then just failed to hold off the rallying favorite. Hinted that he was sitting on a big race, and fits very nicely sprinting for the \$20,000 starter-optional level.
