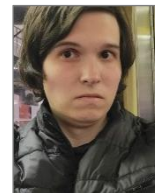

## TODAY'S ANALYSIS - by Dan Illman

### >> RACE 1

#### 1. FLYING TO WORK

#### 2. MARCAN LOVE

#### 3. BOSS LILY

First post is NOON with a LOW 12% takeout on "Value Pick 5" wagers. **FLYING TO WORK** broke slowly, tracked three wide at the back behind a slow pace, made an outside bid on the turn, and got up for second behind a runaway debut winner. Extra distance is a question mark, but he can get a bit closer to the pace given an alert beginning. **MARCAN LOVE** took a nice step forward once Lasix was added to the equation. He lacks early speed, however, and might be at the mercy of race and pace luck. **BOSS LILY** finished ahead of a couple of these when beaten by odds-on Triathlon, who returned to place in a \$12,500 claimer with a 45 Beyer. Adaptable to any race flow, he might attempt stalking tactics this afternoon. Q GOT HOPS tracked three wide over a speed-friendly track, made a two-wide bid under urging, and stayed for second behind the pacesetting winner. His speed allows him to race on or near the lead.

### >> RACE 2

#### 1. SEVEN'S ELEVEN

#### 2. STATES UNITED

#### 3. DAUFUSKIE ISLAND

**SEVEN'S ELEVEN** was pinched at the start, settled at the back while racing off the rail, split rivals three and four wide, and finished evenly in a race dominated by odds-on Freeze the Fire. He's won moving from sprint to route in the past, owns some back class, and can work out an outside, stalking trip. **STATES UNITED** added a hood last week, raced in midpack, made a three-wide bid under urging on the second turn, was floated out when one-paced on the turn, and never threatened the top ones. Seems like a nice fit at this class level, and can showcase a solid late kick. **DAUFUSKIE ISLAND** tracked the winner from the outside, floated off the rail into the stretch, poked a head in front, but couldn't seal the deal. The fourth-finisher then won a conditioned \$7,500 claimer by eight lengths with an 80 Beyer. This distance might be a touch long for him, but he could be the controlling speed. Gomez departs for PUDGE BOY PALACE, who drops down to a winning level after facing Masakado, a next-out 81 Beyer winner in a \$12,000 optional claimer. Hazlewood departs for B D SAINTS.

### >> RACE 3

**FALCON JET**, listed as a Laurel vet scratch (unsound) on 3/8, makes first start for Russell following 118 days on the sidelines. Pressed a reasonable pace three wide when wired in his final start in California, then lost a few lengths in the stretch. Seems well-entered for his circuit debut. **UPSHOT** made a nice late impression when wired by a favored New York shipper, and it won't be any surprise if he shows improved early speed with that race under his belt. This barn went 3 for the last 14 (21%, \$2.07 ROI) with second-out maidens. **COOL CUSTOMER** swaps out cheekpieces for blinkers after contesting fast fractions with the eventual winner at Colonial. He's plenty quick from the gate, and goes out for a barn that went 6 for the last 16 (38%, \$4.25 ROI) with newly-claimed runners. Hazlewood departs for SUMMERINTHECOUNTRY, who has had his share of chances, but shouldn't be too far away when the real running commences. GHOST ARMY (\$27,000 yearling; \$250,000 May juvenile) breezed a furlong in 10 3/5 prior to that 2-year-old sale, and is a half-brother to stakes-winning dirt sprinters Whirlin Curlin (83 dirt Beyer) and Lexington Street (77 dirt Beyer).

## >> RACE 4

### 1. CUT THE CORD

### 3. ARROW SPEED

**CUT THE CORD** hustled hard to set a three-ply pace inside the 9-2 fourth-finisher and 14-1 sixth-finisher, was urged along while attempting to shake clear through a quick third quarter in 24.48 seconds, and held sway. The fifth-finisher then won a dime claimer at Parx by 8 1/4 lengths with an 80 Beyer. He doesn't need the lead and might revert to stalking tactics that led to both wins last year. This barn went 4 for the last 14 (29%, \$2.97 ROI) with newly-claimed horses exiting a win. **CATATUMBO**, listed as a Laurel vet scratch (sick) on 3/28, raced outside at the back, made a three-wide bid under urging, swung five wide, and made up late ground. The fourth-finisher then placed in a \$7,500 "beaten" claimer with a 74 Beyer. Late-runner needs the right race flow. **ARROW SPEED** tracked a fast pace (23.40; 23.52), went on a hard chase to go after the 9-2 runner-up, and finished evenly. The sixth-finisher then won a conditioned starter allowance at Aqueduct with an 86 Beyer. Can get close to more manageable fractions. Chuan departs for DEVIL'S CAY, who was taken in hand to track from the pocket, stalked in between at the back at the three-eighths, swung three wide, and failed to impact. The runner-up then won a \$20,000 starter with an 84 Beyer. Expect a speedy try as he stretches back out in distance. Hazlewood departs this one and Formal Affair for WORK HARD.

## >> RACE 5

### 1. CUPID'S CHOICE

### 3. KNOCK KNOCK

**CUPID'S CHOICE** tracked three wide/four path in a race run during a blizzard, then failed to threaten while tapering over to the inside. She is offered for sale for the first time in her career, and should show good speed against this group for a barn that sent out a 3-2 maiden winner here last Saturday. **HURRAH** (\$20,000 RNA yearling) is a half-sister to one debut winner out of a half to stakes-winning dirt sprinter Taketheodds (86 dirt Beyer) and multiple stakes-placed dirt router Mine Not Mine (won debut; 74 dirt Beyer). The second dam was a Grade 2-winning dirt router (won first three starts). The March 29 work matches up with the barn's Upshot (entered in today's third race). Perhaps they went in company. **KNOCK KNOCK** has some angles as she drops out of the special weight ranks for her second start following a 244-day layoff. Expect a strong late kick. BLUSHING PRINCESS is a half to stakes-placed dirt sprinter Prado Road (88 dirt Beyer).

## >> RACE 6

### 1. SHOT FOR THE MOON

### 3. CHRISTMAS SPIRIT

**SHOT FOR THE MOON** tracked from the pocket, eased out into the stretch, and gave an even finish in his second route appearance. He could use a bit of pace help, but still has some upside potential, and might appreciate cutting back to a one-turn mile for a barn that sent out a 9/2 winner at Charles Town on 3/19. **EDELWEISS** carved out slow fractions when returning from a short layoff, then was too good for bottom maidens. Easily exceeded today's Beyer par, but this still seems like a tougher test from a class and pace standpoint. **CHRISTMAS SPIRIT** sparred with the favored winner, then held nicely for second when finishing ahead of the top pick. He's hit the board in his last four starts, owns the tactical speed to stay close to the pace, and goes out for a barn that sent out a couple of winners on 3/29.

## >> RACE 7

### 1. TAKETHEMONEYHONEY

### 2. MS NOTION

### 3. ATLANTIS QUEEN

**TAKETHEMONEYHONEY**, never out of the exacts from ten starts, tracked the 5-2 lone pacesetter through solid fractions, went on the attack on the turn, and drew off to win the Conniver as much the best. She's a proven commodity over the one-mile distance and figures to be up and on the pace once again. **MS NOTION** pressed the 6-1 runner-up, attacked outside on the turn, then drew clear despite being late to change leads. She's always shown stakes potential, and might be set for another forward move in this, her third start following a 435-day layoff. Might try to find a forward position for a barn that went 9 for the last 46 (20%, \$2.61 ROI) with horses moving from sprint to route. **ATLANTIS QUEEN** stalked three wide, advanced four wide after a half-mile, made a three-wide bid on the second turn under urging, and drew clear to take the Nellie Morse. Kicks late for a barn that went 4 for the last 14 (29%, \$2.26 ROI) with last-out winners.

## >> RACE 8

### 1. QUINT'S BREW

### 2. BLUE KINGDOM

### 3. WORCESTER

**QUINT'S BREW** took advantage of a speed-friendly track to wire them in the Not For Love. He's the kind of horse that doesn't like to be urged along with the whip, and was hand-ridden brilliantly by Forest Boyce to win a thrilling stretch battle. It appears he'll get up and on the pace once again. **BLUE KINGDOM** ran an excellent race when nipped by Quint's Brew. Might have been hurt by the speedy nature of the track, but came with a strong outside bid to just miss. Think he's better suited to this seven-furlong trip, and should come with a late bid. **WORCESTER** is likely the best pure closer in the field, but will need some pace aid as he hikes up in class in search of his third consecutive win.

## >> RACE 9

### 1. TWIRLING BEAUTY

### 2. WONDROUS

### 3. DWELLING LEGACY

Perhaps **TWIRLING BEAUTY**'s last race was a result of a muddy surface, as her two fastest dirt races came over wet tracks, but she looked good in that heat, and should show early speed as she steps back up into the stakes ranks. Cleared off to set the pace inside the odds-on favorite (finished in a dead-heat for third), made an uncontested lead on the turn, and drew away late. That favorite returned to win a high-level allowance at Aqueduct with an 89 Beyer. This barn went 4 for the last 14 (29%, \$6.28 ROI) with horses showing three consecutive ascending Beyers. **WONDROUS** battled for the lead with the odds-on runner-up and drew away to post a comfortable score. Well-bred filly appears to be coming into her own for a barn that went 8 for the last 24 (33%, \$3.55 ROI) with last-out winners removing Lasix. **DWELLING LEGACY** cleared off to set a quick pace over a speed-friendly track, then stayed on for second behind classy Takethemoneyhoney. Think she's going to be in close attendance to the pace.

## >> RACE 10

### 1. WILD VINE

### 2. PAY BILLY

### 3. WARP NINE

**WILD VINE** worked out a nice trip when scoring at Parx. Prompted the 7-1 last-finisher through very reasonable fractions over a sloppy track he adores, battled in between horses after a half-mile, and drew away in visually-impressive fashion. He'll get close to the pace for a barn that went 11 for the last 25 (44%, \$2.04 ROI) with last-out winners in the second start following a 61-120 day layoff. **PAY BILLY** stayed close to a fast interior fraction (22.93 second

quarter), then still had enough in the tank to close down the leaders. He has plenty of back class, and should get a sharp pace to attack for a barn that went 5 for the last 21 (24%, \$2.18 ROI) with last-out winners. **WARP NINE** was no match for the top pick at Parx, but he should receive a stronger race flow this time around, and might be better suited to faster footing. Keep an eye on **UNCLE HEAVY**, a closer who would benefit from quick fractions. Might be racing himself back into shape for this, his fourth race following a 459-day break. The winner of his last race then ran third in a conditioned starter allowance at Aqueduct with a 77 Beyer. **LATE NITE CALL** should show speed from the rail as she faces males.

## >> RACE 11

### 1. LAST GIFT

### 2. SONIC SASS

### 3. HOTMESSNESS

**LAST GIFT** is a four-time winner, and the rest of the field has five wins combined. Set a fast and pressured pace while slightly off the rail, opened a clear lead under a confident ride, and stayed to her task. She looks quick enough to grab the lead for a barn that sent out a 5-2 winner here last Saturday.

**SONIC SASS** took advantage of a quick pace to score over synthetic at Turfway over Dame's Rocket, who then graduated for \$15,000 there with a 46 Beyer. Her two fastest races came on dirt, however, and she can stay within striking range of the leaders in her circuit debut. This barn sent out newly claimed Campaign Mischief to post a synthetic-to-dirt win on 2/13. **HOTMESSNESS** worked out a clean trip stalking a fast pace, was urged along on the turn, cut the corner into the stretch, and got up for second behind the top pick. Expect a strong late kick.

## KALI'S KEYS – by Kali Francois

### Race 1: #6 Boss Lily - 6/1

While most of this field will be rightfully stretching out, and the Chuckie Lawrence horse will undoubtedly take in plenty of money (and rightfully so). There are a lot of horses to like here. However, that second wire will get ya. Boss Lily is the only one with positive experience over this particular type of configuration. The winner of that race ran a good second first time against winners. This was also a significant improvement as opposed to the last time this one tried the one turn.

### Race 2: #4 Daufuskie Island - 5/1

Even in trying the one- turn for the first time, the Ness horse is the horse to beat in this race. If you wanted to try for an exacta though, this is one that's kind of aching for that extra distance. Was well in hand on the backside, and was fighting down the whole stretch - actually, this one was battling around the 3/8th's and was chasing into the battle. In my opinion, was asked too early going to that second wire distance. It made all the difference. With Kevin possibly giving a more demure, easier ride from this one, if it's well-timed correctly, should gun for this distance well.

### Race 3: #2 Upshot - 10/1

This one, like his half Cordmaker, came from off the pace in a 6f race and then went for 7f in the second start (this start, for Upshot). This guy wasn't fan of the dirt in his face, so Toledo promptly kept him out of it. Once they were clear, late and wide, they made up good ground. Along with Cordmaker, another half sibling Las Setas also won in their second start as well.

### Race 8: #4 Worcester - 10/1

With all of the flashy charges in this race, Worcester is a good value even at 6/1. A couple of typical things with Kieron Magee: his first-off-the-claimers are usually a little zippy. That wasn't the case with this guy. From that last race, Sunny Breeze was also a next out winner. The second thing about Kieron is

that he doesn't put horse in stakes company for the whim of it. This is the right next step up and if anything, there's a decent chance of him being an upset in this race and here's why: there will be a lot of gas & go in this race. This guy? He TARGETS, and he targets well. Let's see if he comes back to get his title from last year at a price.

### **Race 10: #9 Pay Billy - 8/1**

Pay Billy will go off shorter than his M/L odds - but I also wouldn't mind him at 4/1 either. In case you were wondering if he really wants the two turns, the answer is yes and this is the most logical next step for him. Pay Billy is quite simply *back!* He just needed to get some races in to get him fighting fit. He needed that second wire which simply tells me that he's ready for the 9f, especially with the way he galloped out. He had no problem getting back to the two turns after the nose defeat in the Miracle Wood, going on to win the Frederico Tesio.

## **MACK'S FACTS – by Mackenzie Pfeiffer**

R1: Marcan Love has made significant improvements in the last two outings, since adding lasix and being gelded. As the best closer in this group, he should appreciate the long stretch while transferring back to the LRL. Boss Lily has put together respectable enough efforts that I find myself intrigued at 6-1 ML, he could be easily overlooked.

R2: States United impressed in recent starts and just never found his way into the race last out, I draw a line through it and give him the chance to jump back into form here. Seven's Eleven has to answer the question of distance here, but he hasn't tried stretching out at this level yet. The run style suits and his other efforts going the distance were in much tougher company.

R3: Falcon Jet transfers over from the West coast and adds lasix for the first time here. The inside isn't much of a deterrent based on the trip from his second career start. I was pretty curious to see Upshot on debut, where he looked green early on but figured out the task at hand later in the race. If the early pace melts down, he looks to be the best closer.

R4: Cut the Cord took command and never looked back when transferring to LRL last out, suspect the tactics will be the same here. He is unlikely to have quite as easy a time making the front end here with Devil's Cay in the mix. Work Hard looks to benefit from a more reasonable pace after being run off of his feet last out.

R5: Knock Knock transfers back to the Mid-Atlantic after being outkicked in her first off the bench. Second off the bench and second time lasix should work well against this group. Blushing Princess could be worth a look in the paddock, the first time starter is a half to Prado Road, and Uncle Lino can produce an early type with speed.

R6: Christmas Spirit looks to have a case of seconditis based on the form, I give him a bit more credit as the company has all been improving. Last out he faced a quality runner taking significant class relief, hard to imagine he ends up in a similar position today. Tethered Soul looks to have been outsprinted against much tougher, class relief could go a long way on the stretch out.

R7: Takethemoneyhoney finds a new group of faces while stretching back out to the mile here. I have some questions of the pace setup, and love the outside post for this mare. Complexity Jane wasn't able to put her trip together last out, the one turn mile may benefit her here...as long as she can work her trip from the inside.

R8: Worcester arrives in very strong form and looks to have timing on his side while returning to stakes company. He should have the pace setup, and the back class, to deliver for a fair price. Another price worth considering is Crab Daddy, never worse than second at this distance, he is a proven closer in career best form.

R9: It's not very often that I find myself landing on an inside speed horse who is transferring in from out of town, yet, Twirling Beauty caught my eye with her last outing. If you're questioning whether the wet track moved her forward, the 2-back winner returned with a stakes winning 93 Beyer. If you're looking for hometown advantage, Dwelling Legacy has the strongest case...especially after missing out to Takethemoneyhoney last out. The outer post should benefit her with the inside speed.

R10: Wild Vine was claimed by Ness in the start following his only try at this distance, a race won by Speedyness. Second off the bench and a career best Beyer lasst out make him hard to go against. Plenty of inside speed should help this race setup well for the closers. I look to Raise Cain, who made an effort despite sprinter style fractions in his last outing. Added ground should suit him well based on the 2-back effort.

R11: Hard to go against the only 4x winner in the group, who proved just how battle tested she is when fighting in between horses and kicking away last out. Stay in Tune made a nice showing on debut for the new connections, Lasix on and weight off here. Ness does very well with his second out types, but I don't find myself willing to take her at a short price here.

Gallop out and running style both suggest he can improve for today's distance too. Needs respecting.</b>   |
| #9 <b>MARCAN LOVE</b>  | Maiden Claiming 16k, 1M 40Y, TAM, Fast Dirt, 01/25/26 – 2 <sup>nd</sup> | Trailed even pace 3W to far turn; advance 4-5W racing to the top of the lane, then rallied nicely but missed.  | <b>He didn't get much of a set up art all in this evenly run race yet still managed to close well, despite sitting a notably wide (widest of all) trip – small UPGRADE. | <b>Other notes:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- After sitting a fractionally wide trip (widest of all but no more than ~4W turn) over 5 1/2F last time, #1 <b>FLYING TO WORK</b> galloped out well enough to at least offer hope that he'll handle today's stretch out.</li> <li>- The chart comment notes how #2 <b>PLENTY ON TAP</b> steadied lightly ~5/8 last time, but it's a stretch to call it a steady and if it was, then it made no difference to his trip or the result. Still, he did spend the duration of this race on the "dead" inside rail and he wasn't hard ridden when beaten in the lane either, exasperating the margin of defeat. While neither factor explain his dull effort, there are ways in which he can step back in the right direction today.</li> <li>- #3 <b>Q GOT HOPS</b> could not reach the gate to wire winner when running over a speed favoring track going 6F last time. While his effort is not worthy of an upgrade, the track bias likely hindered his ability to win this race, and he can be somewhat excused for being beaten as the 4/5 fav. The winner was right outside him throughout, so one should be reluctant to give him much of a pace upgrade; however, he might still be able to improve on the effort if rationing out his speed a little better today, aided by a wide post and addition of blinkers.

#### Other notes:

- While closing from last into just an even pace, **#1 CATATUMBO** lost a little ground coming ~5-6W into the lane last time. He may be able to improve on that try with a faster pace and/or more ground saving trip, especially over 1 1/8M, today. Makes debut for Frock.
- **#3 WORK HARD** brushed with a foe ~3/8 last time but it made no real difference to his trip or the result – he saved ground chasing a fast pace from real but failed to fire and had no excuse. He was a little short of room at a stage in the lane, which maybe cost him ~0.5-1 lengths and therefore a position, but no more than that.
- Although one would have still liked to have seen more from him, **#4 DEVIL'S CAY** did not look to be suited by either the slow pace or 7F distance in his last race, and it would be a surprise if he was to get back on track returned to two-turns today.
- In similar fashion to **#4 DEVIL'S CAY**, **#5 FORMAL AFFAIR** was not helped by the slow pace (25.42, 50.52) in his last race at 1 1/16M - he can likely improve back in the right direction if the pace is hotter today as he drops in class.

- **#1 SNOW BELLA** was not persevered with in the lane when beaten facing restricted stakes foes last time (5 1/2F, CNL, 08/02/25 – 4<sup>th</sup>), greatly exasperating the margin of defeat. Provided she's ready off the bench, she's at least capable of more than she showed there. Returns off layoff with first Lasix today.
- We can't really see enough to upgrade the effort, but **#3 CUPID'S CHOICE** did appear to sit a notably wide trip when finishing 4<sup>th</sup> in the most horrendous conditions (snowstorm) at Colonial last time. A more ground saving trip and better weather (surely) can see her to better effect.
- **#4 KNOCK KNOCK** didn't have a lot of room along the rail shortly after the break last time which resulted in her taking back and racing a little further off the pace than her rider may have desired last time, and then she just looked to get tired in the stretch. Expecting more from her second off the layoff and down in class today.

#### Other notes:

- **#1 TETHERED SOUL** was forwardly placed while saving ground behind a slow pace on a speed favoring track last time which could warrant a downgrade. However, a modestly run sprint might just not be his best game either (and be the reason for his defeat), and his decent gallop out may support this theory. Drops in class and stretches out today. Note: he wears a run-out blinker; he also brushed with the rail in the lane, but that was inconsequential.
- Following an UPGRADABLE effort two-back, **#2 EDELWEISS** destroyed three rivals last time without ever really being asked to run. If the speed figure is to be believed, he can almost certainly run faster.
- Wearing an inside-cup blinker, **#4 RERUN FIRE** raced very awkwardly again on the slop last time. Tough to trust him bouncing back, even if the track comes up fast today.
- **#5 UNCLE GREY** steadied very slightly around the first turn in his last race, but it was only minor interference and made no real difference to his trip or result. The result and fig are fair.
- **#6 RIGHT OF RUSH** caused interference to a rival and bumped when coming down to the rail entering the first turn of his last race, but it hardly impacted him and made little difference to his trip or the result.

### Race 7: The Heavenly Cause Stakes, 3YO+ (F), 1 Mile, Dirt

#### Other Notes:

- **#1 COMPLEXITY JANE** was a little reluctant to load before disappointing somewhat in the Nellie Morris Stakes last time. Note: she also benefited from a closer bias and good pace set up when closing to win the Carousel Stakes two-back.
- **#2 MS NOTION**'s gallop out after winning well over 6F last time was about average, essentially leaving us none the wiser about whether she'll handle today's stretch out to a mile. Her stride turnover slightly leans towards sprinting being her best game, though.
- **#4 KISSEDBYANANGEL** was caught notably wide on the first turn last out, but not wide enough to provide an excuse for her underwhelming effort – she'll need more today.
- **#5 ATLANTIS QUEEN** drew off to win the Nellie Morris Stakes impressively last out – displaying great stamina in doing so - despite having sat a slightly wider than ideal trip.
- **#6 TAKETHEMONEYHONEY** was eased inside the final 1/16 of the Conniver Stakes last time, but it didn't really make any difference to the winning margin, for better or for worse. She sat a good trip, was hard ridden to close home and didn't stop running late, for all that her diet stopped pushing – the result and speed fig seem fair. Note: there was a heavy speed bias present this day, but it didn't seem to make much difference to the result of this three-runner race.

- **#1 BOLD DIVERSION** probably wasn't ever going to hit the board at 22/1 in the Jennings Stakes last time; however, considering the class level, he didn't have quite enough pace to run at either to see him to absolute best effect (slow opening ¼ resulted in speed holding well). Cuts back to 7F today.
- **#5 POINT DUME** was able to establish a relatively uncontested lead in the General George Stakes last time and then set sustainable fractions for the class level in front. Therefore, there is a way in which you can knock him; however, overall, he was just very good on the day and was likely winning whichever way the race panned out. Live player right back.
- **#7 QUINT'S BREW** may well have just simply been best when gamely wiring the field in the Not For Love Stakes last time. However, there was also a significant speed bias present, which very well may have aided him in victory over **#3 BLUE KINGDOM**. Note: he showed a tendency to lug out from the 1/2m pole all the way to the wire.

**Horses to Follow****R5: KNOCK KNOCK (2/1 ML)**

It's unlikely we saw the best of KNOCK KNOCK when tackling open MSW company at the Fair Grounds last out—she was making her dirt debut, returning from 244 days off, and drew the rail, which didn't help. Now dropping into maiden claiming company second off the layoff, with added fitness and a better draw, she's set for a step forward that could easily see her graduate in today's fifth.

**R8: TWIRLING BEAUTY (7/2 ML)**

TWIRLING BEAUTY has only made three starts without Lasix, but two of them stand out as clear career-best efforts—an 85 Beyer when runner-up to JUSTINQUESO in last year's Lady Erie Stakes, and a dominant allowance win in New York last time (90 Beyer). Notably, connections again opted to forgo the medication in that latest start, suggesting she may simply be better without it. The form has already been franked, too, with multiple stakes winner IRISH MAXIMA—beaten eight lengths that day—returning to win with an 89 Beyer. Either of those efforts makes her a major player in today's Primonetta, and from gate two she should land a favorable forward position. At a 7/2 morning line, she looks a serious win contender.

Swung widest into the stretch, and was no match for the pacesetter winner, but did show some interest on the gallop-out. Thirteen-time winner deserves another shot in a \$7,500 conditioned seller.

### BRUNO

Independence Hall colt showed promising workouts prior to his debut, then hooked up in an early speed duel before succumbing to a late runner that benefited from the quick pace. Earned a respectable 69 Beyer Speed Figure, and will be tough right back against maiden special weight company.
