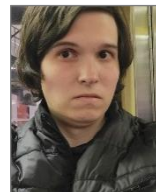

TODAY'S ANALYSIS - by Dan Illman

>> RACE 1

1. SELL IT

2. MR. FUNTASTICO

3. BREWMASTER

The first post is 12 pm ET, and there are two "Value Pick 5" wagers, each with a LOW 12% takeout rate. **SELL IT** gave a good turf try in his first after a whopping 440-day layoff. Saved ground at the back behind a quick pace, cut the corner, and was a bit tight squeezing through on the fence, then showed some life in the final furlong. The third-finisher next scored a \$30,000 starter-optional with a 72 Beyer. Back to his best surface after a dull dirt try, he might be set for his best in the third of the form cycle. Sanchez lands here instead of Celtic Prince. **MR. FUNTASTICO** pulled early to stalk from in between, swapped leads a couple of times on the second turn, eased outside, then made up two lengths on the 41-1 pacesetting winner. He's hit the board in his last four for a jockey-trainer combination that sent out a 9-2 winner at Tampa on 4/26. **BREWMASTER** saved ground in midpack, split rivals, then changed back to his left lead when finishing evenly. The runner-up next placed in a \$15,000 "non-two" seller at Turfway with a 68 Beyer. Curious to see if he'll need one off the layoff for a barn that sent out an 8-5 turf winner on 5/31. Vargas departs for TRIATHELON. MONTERREY deserves a look if able to escape the Also Eligible list. RETURN FIRE set the pace on the fence on turf two back, then held second over four of these. Expect good speed.

>> RACE 2

1. RAISIN WEEKEND

2. WIRETAPPED

3. LOVE YOU LOVE YOU

RAISIN WEEKEND settled in midpack behind a fast pace in her debut, made a three-wide bid, and tried hard for second behind a 1-10 betting favorite. Might not have been over her best surface/distance when going two turns on grass three weeks ago, and should show a late kick for a barn that went 7 for 16 (44%, \$4.53 ROI) between 5/16 and 5/31. **WIRETAPPED** was in tough setting a very fast pace in the Weber City Miss, a race where the top-four finishers were eighth, fifth, sixth, and seventh after a half. The third-finisher then placed in the Grade 2 Black-Eyed Susan with a 78 Beyer. Back to basics sprinting, she should get close to the pace for a barn that went 11 for the last 27 (41%, \$2.05 ROI) in the first after a trainer switch. **LOVE YOU LOVE YOU** (\$60,000 weanling) is out of a full sister to five blacktype earners, including Grade 1-winning dirt router Giant Oak. Sire - broodmare sire cross produced multiple Grade 3-winning turf router Forever After All. The May 29 work matches the barn's 4-year-old Cat Fast (entered in the third race). Perhaps they breezed in company. Might want a bit more ground and/or turf-synthetic. **BLUSHING PRINCESS** dueled with the odds-on third-finisher through fast fractions before tiring. Faced three next-out winners, with the runner-up winning for the state-sired waiver with a 61 Beyer. **ADA GIRL ADALINE** acted up prior to the start, then rallied late behind Cross of Valor, who next graduated for the waiver in an off-turf heat with a 53 Beyer.

>> RACE 3

1. MARKET WATCH

2. CAT FAST

3. EDELWEISS

MARKET WATCH set the pace from the inside in a recent two-turn heat at Charles Town, took pressure from the odds-on winner, and tried hard to the wire. He finished second but was placed first via disqualification, and should race close to the pace once again for a barn that went 6 for the last 12 (50%, \$3.87 ROI) with last-out maiden winners. **CAT FAST** took advantage of moderate splits when just lasting against maiden claimers in New York. The runner-up then ran third in a quarter maiden claimer at Aqueduct with a 65 Beyer. He might face a faster pace this time for a barn that went 5 for the last 12 (42%, \$3.15 ROI) with last-out winners returning on dirt. **EDELWEISS** was wired by the even-money favorite last month, but he's exceeded today's Beyer par in

two of his last three races. His good tactical speed should have him in range when they turn for home. Barbosa lands here instead of Keen Talent. CHAPERONE faced better at Oaklawn, as the sixth-finisher then won two in a row with Beyers of 79 and 80. Kicks late in first start for Ness barn.

>> RACE 4

1. FALCON JET

2. MAGIC WALLET

3. MAX CAPACITY

FALCON JET might have found the distance too far, and the company too steep when racing in the restricted Sir Barton. Looked good graduating going short in his first for Brittany Russell, and should appreciate cutting back in trip while getting Lasix again. The barn went 6 for the last 14 (43%, \$5.32 ROI) when moving from route to sprint. Probably best to draw a line through **MAGIC WALLET**'s most recent start, as he was overmatched in the Grade 3 Chick Lang. Gave a good try following a long layoff in his prior outing, and might be set for his best in the third start of the campaign. Kicks late for a barn that went 5 for the last 18 (28%, \$2.06 ROI) in the third after 180-365 day layoffs. **MAX CAPACITY** has angles, as he turns back to his favorite distance while racing as a new gelding. Chased a very fast pace at Tampa last month when finishing ahead of Battalion Leader, who then took a restricted "non-two" allowance at Lone Star with a 65 Beyer. The barn went 7 for the last 15 (47%, \$2.99 ROI) with dirt horses in the second after 61-120 day layoffs. **MO'S GLITTER** ran a strong race in the Maryland Million Nursery, as he set a very fast pace over a closer-friendly track before falling short by less than a length. Finished ahead of two next-out winners, and Big Cuddle then hit the board in his next two with a 92 Beyer top. Figures on the lead.

>> RACE 5

1. RECKER POINT

2. LOVE ME NOT

3. POKER JOKER

RECKER POINT looked a bit hot exiting the paddock before his turf start two back, then broke slow. He tracked while three wide, then finished evenly against a pretty solid group. This class level should be more to his liking. Uncoupled stablemate **LOVE ME NOT** cleared off to set an uncontested pace on Laurel turf last fall, took some pressure from the 9-2 fifth-finisher, and tired. He has the tactical speed to sit close to the leaders. Sanchez lands here instead of Hunter Joe. **POKER JOKER** saved ground in midpack behind a quick pace, saved ground entering the third turn, split rivals at the three-sixteenths, then stormed home along the inside in an 11-furlong marathon at Tampa Bay. The fourth-finisher next won two in a row with Beyers of 91 and 86. This seems like a tough assignment in his first following a 440-day break. Think we'll see speed from **MONGOLIAN APPLE**, as he ships in from Southern California after facing Ah Jeez, who then placed in a quarter claimer with an 84 Beyer. **SELL SOMETHING** was wired in his seasonal debut, but might receive a quicker race flow. **EL TINMARIN** is another that was wired in his most recent turf start. **WON AN AWARD** saved ground near the back, was shuffled back a bit at the half-mile, eased four wide, then made up four lengths late. The runner-up next ran third in a \$40,000 optional claimer with an 81 Beyer.

>> RACE 6

1. THEMIS

2. ANGELS ENVY

3. MUSIC BOX

THEMIS switches surfaces as the first foal out of stakes-placed turf sprinter Compensate (77 dirt Beyer top). The sire clicks with 23% of turf sprinters. Breezed outside 3-year-old maiden winner Lennox the Grey (64 turf Beyer) on 5/28, finished a neck back, and was a few lengths behind on the gallop-out. This barn went 10 for the last 31 (32%, \$4.90 ROI) with experienced horses switching to turf for the first time. **ANGELS ENVY** saved ground in midpack behind a quick pace, eased out into the stretch, and then only finished evenly behind three first-time starters. Expect a solid late kick with new blinkers.

MUSIC BOX switches surfaces as a half-sister to a turf winner. Showed good speed in her debut for a barn that went 10 for the last 46 (22%, \$2.47 ROI) with experienced horses switching to turf for the first time. **SIN BOLDLY** was wired by the favorite in her seasonal debut. Stalked three wide, then rallied into second despite hopping back to her left lead).

>> RACE 7

1. VANILLA

2. MON REVE

3. LA CHISMOSA

VANILLA set a pressured pace inside the 7-2 runner-up while racing just off the rail, then stayed strong in the stretch. She doesn't need the lead to succeed, and might opt for the rating tactics that resulted in her victory in New York three back. The barn went 11 for the last 30 (37%, \$2.25 ROI) in the first after the claim. **MON REVE** pressed a moderate pace at Monmouth, then drew off to graduate by open lengths. This is a tougher spot from a class and pace perspective, but it appears she has good upside potential. Kingsley lands here instead of Getting Closer. **LA CHISMOSA** was no match for a 1-10 favorite in a restricted stakes race at Gulfstream, but she seems very well-entered for her circuit debut. She's won her last two starts with Lasix, and the trainer-jockey combination sent out a 17-1 winner here on 5/29. **GREEK HEIRESS** should show some speed after placing ahead of Sassafressness, who then won two in a row at Delaware with Beyers of 78 and 80.

>> RACE 8

1. MOPO

2. RIVER SEINE

3. CHANTICO

MOPO (wore a hood last time) sat a nice pocket trip behind a quick pace, raced in behind the leader in the upper stretch, bulled her way out to split horses, and finished with a flourish to score her seasonal debut. The runner-up then took a state-sired allowance with an 88 Beyer. Believe she's found her calling as a turf sprinter, and should provide a strong late burst. Boyce lands here instead of Chantico. **RIVER SEINE** wasn't away the best at Gulfstream, then went up to press the odds-on winner from the outside. No match for that foe, but stayed on very well for second, and was flattered when Sunna repeated in The Very One Stakes with a 90 Beyer. That was her first start since being purchased at auction for \$60,000, and she should show good speed this afternoon. **CHANTICO** pressed the 2-1 fifth-finisher, went on the attack on the turn, then lasted for second behind the favorite despite being late to change leads. Should be in the thick of things when the field turns into the long stretch.

>> RACE 9

1. NO MO MUFFINS

2. MISS PIERRE

3. MAIDSTONE

NO MO MUFFINS took dirt while saving ground in midpack behind a hot pace at Penn National, raced on hold at the three-eighths marker, angled four wide into the stretch, then only finished evenly, albeit with a solid gallop-out. That race produced three next-out winners, with the last-finisher taking a \$16,000 starter-optional there by 14 3/4 lengths with an 81 Beyer. Expect her to get closer to the pace. **MISS PIERRE** is basically unexposed on dirt, as she might have been overmatched against restricted stakes horses in her lone prior surface try at Fort Erie. Lots of angles this afternoon as she moves from route to sprint and turf to dirt for her second start of the year. **MAIDSTONE** pushed the favored third-finisher over a speed-friendly track, then went about her business to score. Looks like the main speed for a barn that went 9 for the last 23 (39%, \$2.57 ROI) in the first after the claim.

MACK'S FACTS – by Mackenzie Pfeiffer

R1: Mr. Funtastico has shown improving form in recent starts, despite a few troubled trips, he should be able to sit close to the early pace with a stalk and pounce move. Tactics is unlikely to be anywhere near the pace, but I have been waiting to see him try the turf since his maiden score here. Russell aboard could be a good sign, he piloted this one for the maiden win in November.

R2: Wiretapped is hard to take at even money, but the change in company and while remaining protected is a good sign for me. I give her one more try here. Ada Girl Adaline did not look the part of a first time starter when I saw her on debut, despite the troubled trip, she ran quite well. If she can stay to task, there could be plenty of room for improvement in her second start.

R3: This has the potential for a Farrior exacta, with horses who have done it before. I lean a bit more towards Keen Talent, who overcame a troubled trip last out with win from off the pace with a wide trip at CT. The one turn mile configuration looks to suit him well here. Cat Fast was originally a \$650k purchase, who hasn't been able to string much of a campaign together. With a few starts under him, there might be more to offer here.

R4: Falcon Jet gets back to basics, where his outer post may be to his benefit with the abundant speed to his inside. Max Capacity is in a similar position, both lifetime wins have come over this distance, and he may present a better price.

R5: El Tinmarin faced strong company for his first start of the turf season, a bit of class relief has him placed competitively here. In a race without an abundance of speed, Love Me Not may take an early command, I suspect he will return to form while getting back to the preferred surface.

R6: Peace Before Chaos hasn't had the easiest of trips but she has outrun her odds in both of her last two starts. A half to Speightful Sis, this filly may be able to transfer her form just the same if she works a clean trip. Angels Envy is one I will have to price shop, she makes plenty of sense shipping in from NY and adding blinkers, Cruz should fit her well.

R7: La Chismosa has worked her way up the levels, earning back to back stakes placings against two very in form fillies, she looks well spotted here and benefits from a work over the surface. Greek Heiress has made big steps in recent starts while facing the right types, she may benefit from the outer post here.

R8: Mopo jumped right back into form when winning first off the bench with a patient trip on a speed favoring turf course, no doubt she will have pace to target here. River Seine has a bit of work to do while adding ground here, but her last outing certainly jumps out at 8-1 ML. The winner, Sunna, has no shortage of speed and has won 2x since, including the The Very One.

R9: Sticking to the level, I find Maidstone to be a logical play first off the bench. Class relief and the blinkers off seemed to work in her last two starts, likely a better price than the Russell runner to her outside.

Last Race: Dec. 27, 8th race

Finish: 5th by 9 1/2

Appeared on the upswing, but threw in a puzzler in the Heft Stakes, where the pace situation was not to his liking. Forced to chase the gate to wire winner while 3 wide early, raced 4-5 wide leaving the 3/8 pole, then flat when asked.

LOVELIEST

Trainer: Eddie Kenneally

Last Race: April 17, Race 7

Finish: 8th by 6 3/4

Class drop might be in order after filly tired badly in a first-level allowance sprinting on the grass. She was bumped during the opening furlong while pressing the winner from the rail before giving way. She is quick from the gate, and that speed would play well at a lower class level.

PARIS BY NIGHT

Trainer: John Robb

Last Race: May 22, 2nd race

Finish: 3rd by 1 1/2

Noteworthy debut for the Golden Lad filly from the John Robb barn. Acted a bit green and playful in the post parade, broke a step slow, sent up between runners, then settled for third as a beaten favorite.

RERUN TABLE

Trainer: John Salzman Jr.

Last Race: May 30, 4th race

Finish: 2nd by 3/4

Maryland-bred displayed her tactical speed while rating 3 wide, bid between horses on the turn, then fought gamely with eventual winner Slewperitus to the wire. She continued with plenty of stamina on the gallop out.

SUJO (*Breezed 4F - :48.20 at TAM on 2/22*)

Trainer: Greg Sacco

Last Race: Jan. 16, 7th race

Finish: 4th by 4 3/4 lengths

First-time starter was pinballed from in between horses at the start, and dropped all the way back to last. Started to kick in at the eighth pole, angled to the fence, and just missed getting third on the wire with a nice gallop-out.

ITHADTOBEBLU

Trainer: Hugh McMahan

Last Race: May 22, 9th race

Finish: 3rd by 1 1/4

Bumped eventual winner Knock Knock when stumbling and coming out at the start in a dirt sprint taken off turf. She recovered to save ground, putting in a steady rally to finish third. Look for a better effort on turf or dirt going long.

YOUR LORDSHIP

Last Race: May 30, 7th race

Finish: 1st by 2 3/4

It could be a fun 4-year-old summer on the turf for the Graham Motion-trained runner. Racing as a first-time gelding, Your Lordship rated long with plenty of confidence throughout, waited to pounce in the upper stretch, and angled and swept clear for the win

PUT A ROCK ON IT

Trainer: Kieron Magee

Last Race: May 31, 7th race

Finish: 2nd by nose

Tackled males in her first start back from Texas, and gave a strong late rally to just miss the favored Class Photo. She seems very comfortable at distances ranging from a mile to nine furlongs on turf, and would benefit from getting back in with fillies in a starter allowance spot.

DOLICE VITA

Trainer: Robin Graham

Last Race: May 31, 9th race

Finish: 3rd by neck

Broke from the far outside post position going 1 1/16 miles on the main track, and was hung out wide every step of the way. Despite the ground loss, he was trying hard every step to the wire when beaten by a ground-saving, pace-setting winner.

THE ROUND-UP - by John Piasek, *The Racing Biz*

A recap of SUNDAY, MAY 31 action at Laurel Park. Visit theracingbiz.com for John Piasek's FREE full analysis of today's Laurel card.

Race 1: Destination made the early lead and the rail, was collared by Gripen at the top of the stretch, and repelled her for her first grass victory. This was her third gate-to-wire win in her last five races.

Race 2: El Papacito set the pace and faded, setting it up perfectly for Gimme Two Shoes, who was getting Lasix for the first time. He swooped to the lead at the top of the lane and drew off, with El Papacito holding second and chronic maiden Flying to Work no better than third.

Race 3: In her first start since last August, Roadrunner the Cat set the early pace with a line of three runners right behind her. One of them was **Sweeterthanwhiskey**, who took advantage of her trip to win in her second start off the bench. Roadrunner the Cat faded to fourth, but might have needed the race and is worth watching for next time. Neither of the other two pace-stalkers hung around late.

Race 4: This race was over after an eighth of a mile. **Ecumenical** cleared to the rail and the lead from the outside post and held on the rest of the way. City Panda ran about as well as he could given the circumstances, rallying from next-to-last to get second. Silverbullettwenty came from last to third.

Race 5: Fahnee faded after setting fast early fractions, which looked as if it would set up perfectly for catbird seat-sitting Hot Boss. However, he too was mowed down by **Stay in Tune**, who surged down the center of the track to win.

Race 6: Fightertown and White Series dueled each other in the early stages, and it looked like Fightertown would win the battle and the war when he pulled clear late. However, the duel soon took its effects on him, and he began to drift out. **Daddy Yankee** took advantage, surging up the inside to win at 14-1. Fightertown finished five lengths clear of White Series, who managed to hold third.

Race 7: Class Photo sat off the pace on the rail and looked like he was absolutely loaded on the far turn. He found daylight at the top of the lane and wore down Bodecream, then held off the frantic charge of Put a Rock On It to win by a nose. He's now 2-for-2 at the meet, with both of his wins coming in photo finishes.

Race 8: Big Earn raced off the pace in the three-path and looked ready to run throughout. When Jorge Ruiz asked her the question, she responded affirmatively, rolling past early leader Lady Ensign. Clawless Brit raced on the rail and got going late to complete the exacta.

Race 9: Guaponess looked like the dominant speed on paper, and played that role on the track. He set an uncontested pace and had just enough left to hold on over Roll on Jesse and Dolice Vita, the latter of whom ran a huge race despite racing wide throughout.

Race 10: Golf Cart Ryder surged past the embattled early leaders, opened up a clear stretch lead, then held off Paid Vacation's late rally as Jorge Ruiz completed a grass hat trick. He's hitting at 28.5% with his grass mounts at the meet.
