## TODAY'S ANALYSIS - by Dan Illman

### >> RACE 1

#### 1. ENZO

#### 2. LANNISTER

#### 3. GOLDEN DESCENT

The first post time is 12 pm ET, and there are two "Value Pick 5" wagers, each with a LOW 12% takeout rate. **ENZO** gave a good try the last time he raced on turf. Battled for the lead from in between, then stayed for second behind the 2-1 second choice. That race produced two next-out winners, with Knockanara taking three more in a row with Beyers of 80, 80, and 84 (he's now stakes-placed). Toss out his last, as he was in steep following a nine-month layoff with some quality dirt horses. Expect him to get close to the pace for a barn that sent out four winners last month. **LANNISTER** has strong turf bloodlines, and he returns to the surface for the first time since a rallying fourth in his grass debut. Settled back off a strong pace, swung very wide, and made up 5 1/2 lengths. The seventh-finisher then placed in a first-level allowance with a 77 Beyer. **GOLDEN DESCENT** has found his home sprinting on the turf. Settled back behind a quick opening quarter last month and avoided severe traffic by rallying on the outside. The third-finisher then graduated for the Maryland-bred waiver with a 68 Beyer. The barn scored with last-out maiden winner West Mountain at 8-1 odds on turf on 5/30.

### >> RACE 2

#### 1. KESSEL RUN

#### 2. BARU

#### 3. RAINONTHESCARECROW

**KESSEL RUN** (\$5,000 yearling) is the second starter out of a three-time winner that raced exclusively in turf routes. That dam is a half-sister to stakes-placed dirt sprinter Bagpipes (84 dirt Beyer). There are dirt influences deeper in the female family, and the barn went 3 for the last 14 (21%, \$4.18 ROI) with first-time starters. **BARU** tracked the pace from the inside in his debut, cut the corner into the stretch, then finished behind the three more-experienced favorites after being very late to change leads. This barn won that race with a second-time starter, and they seem to improve their babies after a race or two. It appears that uncoupled stablemates **RAINONTHESCARECROW** and FUTILE GESTURE have been working together in preparation for this start. The former is a half-brother to the quick turf sprinter Clawless Brit. Futile Gesture, meanwhile, is the first starter out of a dam that earned \$212,138. His second dam was a stakes-placed turf router (84 turf Beyer). **MONETA AGENDA** was wired in a slow-paced race where they ran 1-2 around the track. The runner-up then returned to beat Baru with a 44 Beyer.

### >> RACE 3

#### 1. BOSS LILY

#### 2. IT'S ELECTRIC

#### 3. UNDER THE RUG

**BOSS LILY** tracked from in between foes, eased out three wide with clear aim into the stretch, then grinded away to fall a neck short. The longshot winner proved his race was no fluke by next winning a \$16,000 "non-two" starter with a 71 Beyer. It seems like he's improved since switched to the grass, and he can get close to the pace. **IT'S ELECTRIC** returns from a 318-day layoff as a new gelding at a reduced class level. Hopped at the start last time, stalked outside, made a three-wide bid as the pace quickened, then swapped back to his left lead. The winner then hit the board in three of his next four with a 79 Beyer top. This barn went 5 for the last 16 (31%, \$2.08 ROI) moving from maiden special to maiden claiming. Ruiz lands here instead of My Friend Lou. **UNDER THE RUG** looked good in his turf debut. Tracked a fast pace from the pocket, cut the corner after making an early lead change, and succumbed to two closers that benefited from those energetic fractions. The fifth-finisher then hit the board in his next two starts with Beyers of 70 and 71. **FIVE MINUTES MORE** has angles adding Lasix for his second start following a 225-day layoff. Finished behind Skycross in that race, and that foe then placed in

a maiden special weight with a 66 Beyer.

#### >> RACE 4

**GREYLINE STATION** prompted the 14-1 third-finisher through quick fractions of 23.68 and 23.27 over a closer-friendly track, altered course inside that drifting foe turning into the long stretch, then was kicked down late by a good-setup closer. His tactical speed allows him to work out a tracking trip for a barn that scored with 3-1 Jolly by Golly on 5/29. Vargas lands here instead of Master Schemer. **LOOKIN AT MAC** might have taken advantage of a speed-friendly track, but there's no denying he improved by leaps and bounds in his first start for the Ness barn. Pushed the 3-1 fifth-finisher in the early stages, then put the boots to that field in the stretch. He'll show early speed as he attempts a one-turn mile this afternoon. Hazlewood lands here instead of Tethered Soul. **TELL 'EM I'M COMIN** takes a significant drop in class after being wired by a 1-10 favorite in a slow-paced race over a speed-friendly track. The third-finisher then scored an off-turf first-level allowance with an 82 Beyer. Late-runner needs a strong pace.

#### >> RACE 5

### 1. NOAH CHANCE

### 2. BARZINI

### 3. TOUGH WORKOUT

**NOAH CHANCE** prompted a moderate pace while three wide, attacked from the outside on the turn, then drew clear in sharp fashion. Beat three of these that afternoon, and is tactical enough to work out a similar trip from just off the pace for a barn that sent out three winners since 5/22. **BARZINI** last raced on July 9, was listed as a Colonial vet scratch 24 days later, then was a Laurel vet scratch 19 days ago. Perhaps this is a suspicious drop as he returns from a 332-day layoff at a vastly reduced level, but his "A" race puts him in the winner's circle. Wired in that last start, he pulled his way along to track from in between, altered course to the fence, eased outside, and was second best. The third-finisher then grabbed a second-level allowance at Colonial with an 86 Beyer. Capable of a nice pace-tracking, ground-saving trip for a barn that went 3 for the last 14 (21%, \$2.86 ROI) with turf horses returning from 180-365 day layoffs. **TOUGH WORKOUT** wheels back on short notice with the speed to get up and on the pace.

#### >> RACE 6

### 1. IRISH B GOODE

### 2. HYLLA

### 3. I'MAMATERIALGIRL

**IRISH B GOODE** tracked from the pocket at Colonial, altered course up the inside in the upper stretch, then finished evenly. The runner-up then won two in a row (synthetic with a 67 Beyer, turf with a 71). This barn sent out 1-5 maiden winner Karma's Inthehouse following a similar layoff on 5/23. **HYLLA** battled with the 13-1 winner over a speed-friendly track, swapped leads early on the turn when outpaced along the fence, altered outside in the upper stretch, and stayed on for second. She might be the controlling speed for a barn that went 7 for the last 10 (70%, \$3.22 ROI) in the second start after the claim. Hazlewood lands here instead of **I'MAMATERIALGIRL**, who was hustled out of there to chase a quick pace from in between rivals, dropped down to the fence on the turn, then lasted for second behind a runaway favorite. **FEEL THE BOLT** was wired on dirt two back, and tries her luck again with blinkers. Might get a faster pace to attack this time.

## >> RACE 7

### 1. GONNA MAKE IT

### 2. PLENTY ON TAP

### 3. OXFORD UNION

**GONNA MAKE IT** broke well on turf two back, was bumped from in between horses on the first turn, and wound up in tight in between on the backstretch. Found the pocket on the second turn, cut the corner, and was outfinished, albeit with a decent gallop-out. Think he's better on this surface, and gets back to turf after failing to threaten last week on the main track. Hoping he gets outside and in the clear this time. Karamanos departs for Oxford Union.

**PLENTY ON TAP** stalked from in between, stayed inside turning for home, then finished evenly while over in behind rivals. Hazlewood departs for Tiz the Great. **OXFORD UNION** pulled early to save ground near the back, raced in between after a half-mile, eased outside, then switched to his left lead when altering course wider in the stretch. The winner repeated in a \$16,000 "non-two" starter with a 71 Beyer. Late-runner needs the right pace and trip. **HARD STANCE** should show speed after prompting fast fractions sprinting. The fourth-finisher graduated for the Maryland-bred waiver with a 68 Beyer. Think there's enough pedigree for him to last the mile.

## >> RACE 8

### 1. INTREPID MO

### 2. DI'S SURPRISE

### 3. SHEILAH'S WARCLOUD

**INTREPID MO** might have needed her last start, the first run following a 173-day layoff. Cleared off to set an uncontested pace through very reasonable fractions, came off the inside turning for home, then tired in the lane. Doesn't need the lead to win for a barn that went 5 for the last 14 (36%, \$3.56 ROI) with dirt horses in the second start following 120-180 day layoffs. Hazlewood lands here instead of **DI'S SURPRISE**, who brings some dirtied-up form to this heat. Likely gained fitness last time when returning from a five-month layoff on turf, and was in very tough against stakes rivals in her prior three starts. The last time she raced with Lasix on dirt, she pulled off a 48-1 upset. The barn went 4 for the last 11 (36%, \$2.27 ROI) moving from sprint to route.

**SHEILAH'S WARCLOUD** might be set for her best as she stretches out following two sprints in her third start of the year. Tracked three wide on dirt two back when wired, was urged along on the turn, and kept trying in the stretch. The fourth-finisher then took a \$30,000 claimer with a 77 Beyer. **THE GODDESS FACTOR** should get some pace to attack after chasing Disco Rules, who then placed in a second-level Delaware allowance with an 83 Beyer.

## >> RACE 9

### 1. SLEEPWALKER

### 2. ACHERON

### 3. DOESN'THURTTOLIRT

**SLEEPWALKER** closed out 2025 with a bang, winning both starts after being claimed by Brittany Russell. Raced three wide every step of the way last time, then dug in gamely to score against a weaker "non-three" group. Tactical enough to adapt to any pace scenario. **ACHERON** seems well-entered after kicking down the pacesetter in a conditioned allowance at Gulfstream. That was a career-best performance for a filly that has hit the board in her last three turf appearances. **DOESN'THURTTOLIRT** scored off a five-month layoff here last year, and now returns from 203 days on the sidelines for a new barn. Faced a good group in her most recent start, as the winner returned to place in a second-level allowance at Churchill with an 82 Beyer. Late-runner needs pace and race luck. **HEAVEN'S PROMISE** can show speed in this spot after facing Galley Head, who returned to take a first-level Tapeta allowance at Woodbine with a 74 Beyer.

## >> RACE 10

### 1. OCEAN SOUND

### 2. BRUNO

### 3. CHOWSER

Taking a guess with **OCEAN SOUND**, who disappointed in his turf debut three weeks ago. His dam was stakes-placed going long on turf, but she also won a couple of races on dirt, and there are dirt influences deeper in the female family. The 5/29 workout matches up with the barn's 4-year-old Wicked Boss (46 dirt Beyer). Perhaps they went in company. **BRUNO** looks like the one to beat after two promising performances. Broke slowly in his debut, battled outside the 5-1 last-finisher, opened a clear lead, and was kicked down by the favorite. Away slowly again last time, he saved ground in midpack, eased outside under urging, then stayed on for third. With an alert break, he can get up and on the pace. **CHOWSER** pulled early to save ground near the back at Churchill, eased three wide into the upper stretch, and couldn't threaten. The runner-up then compiled a record of 4-3-1-0 with a 95 Beyer top. Kicks on in the stretch, but must prove this distance isn't too sharp. **BOLTON HILL** is a half-brother to stakes-winning dirt sprinter Super Accelerate (90 dirt Beyer) out of stakes-winning turf router Bawlmer Hon (82 dirt Beyer).

### MACK'S FACTS – by Mackenzie Pfeiffer

R1: Lannister gets back over to the turf, where he ran a career best 3-back, and looks to have room for improvement again here. Likely remains a reasonable price with Enzo in here. Golden Descent didn't look to be a fluke when winning last out, switching tactics seemed to be to his benefit while targeting a strong early pace.

R2: Baru has the benefit of a race under his belt, where he tired after early efforts. He may ultimately appreciate added ground, but the experience counts for quite a bit in this group. Magic Elixir comes out of the same race, where he was caught wide and broke poorly. The half siblings have shown a bit more on debut, I give him a second chance here.

R3: Under the Rug took well to the turf and did plenty of hard work, a slight cutback in distance and second try on the grass is enough for me to get behind him at 8-1 ML. It's Electric is likely to take all the money here, we just haven't seen enough for me to feel justified, especially with the major class drop.

R4: Greyline Station has found his way ever since adding blinkers, with weight off he should be able to sit close and work a similar trip to the maiden score. Majestic Blue adds blinkers for the first time here, something that might benefit him as he has gotten a bit lost in recent trips. Toledo in the irons could be a good fit.

R5: Noah Chance hasn't missed a beat since returning from his winter break, with the inside post and tactical speed he has options on how to work a winning trip. Class relief isn't quite enough for me to use Barzini on top at such a short price, I give him one race off the bench.

R6: Hylla could be a likely single on many tickets after her productive first off the claim effort. Back to a fast main track, and likely the lone speed, should work for her today. Charcoal Queen faced a very different group on debut and likely benefits from the class relief and lasix on combination here. Room for improvement as she makes her 3 y/o debut.

R7: Tiz the Great looked to be outsprinted in his first try on the turf, stretching out should work to his advantage and has the recency to handle it. Oxford Union may benefit from the pace setup with his late running style, Karamanos fit him well against tougher company last year, this level seems to be the right fit.

R8: Intrepid Mo gets back to a fast main track and looks to have speed to target, potentially setting up a similar trip to her 7f win in October. Hard to deny even with the 1-1 ML. The Goddess Factor gets a big class test here but Boyce aboard may benefit with a ground saving trip. If you can draw a line through the last out, she presents a fair play.

R9: Sleepwalker has tactical speed on her side, something that could be key in this group. Stepping up in company seems warranted with her perfect 2/2 record since being claimed. Devastating faced a much tougher allowance group on Preakness day after being claimed back for Bailes. Likely presents a better value with upside in her third start off the bench.

R10: Bruno has put together two big efforts in his short career, he looks to have found the right spot to take the next step forward here, even at a short price. Bolton Hill could be the best value in this group, while the pedigree just scream debut winner, this half to Super Accelerate has plenty of dirt sprinting pedigree and a work tab to support it.

### **POWER GRID** (*Breezed 3F - :36.00 at LRL on 5/31*)

**Trainer:** Jerry Robb

**Last Race:** Dec. 27, 8<sup>th</sup> race

**Finish:** 5<sup>th</sup> by 9 1/2

Appeared on the upswing, but threw in a puzzler in the Heft Stakes, where the pace situation was not to his liking. Forced to chase the gate to wire winner while 3 wide early, raced 4-5 wide leaving the 3/8 pole, then flat when asked.

### **LOVELIEST**

**Trainer:** Eddie Kenneally

**Last Race:** April 17, Race 7

**Finish:** 8th by 6 3/4

Class drop might be in order after filly tired badly in a first-level allowance sprinting on the grass. She was bumped during the opening furlong while pressing the winner from the rail before giving way. She is quick from the gate, and that speed would play well at a lower class level.

### **PARIS BY NIGHT**

**Trainer:** John Robb

**Last Race:** May 22, 2nd race

**Finish:** 3rd by 1 1/2

Noteworthy debut for the Golden Lad filly from the John Robb barn. Acted a bit green and playful in the post parade, broke a step slow, sent up between runners, then settled for third as a beaten favorite.

### **RERUN TABLE**

**Trainer:** John Salzman Jr.

**Last Race:** May 30, 4th race

**Finish:** 2nd by 3/4

Maryland-bred displayed her tactical speed while rating 3 wide, bid between horses on the turn, then fought gamely with eventual winner Slewperitus to the wire. She continued with plenty of stamina on the gallop out.

### **SUJO** (*Breezed 4F - :48.20 at TAM on 2/22*)

**Trainer:** Greg Sacco

**Last Race:** Jan. 16, 7<sup>th</sup> race

**Finish:** 4<sup>th</sup> by 4 3/4 lengths

First-time starter was pinballed from in between horses at the start, and dropped all the way back to last. Started to kick in at the eighth pole, angled to the fence, and just missed getting third on the wire with a nice gallop-out.

### **ITHADTOBEBLU**

**Trainer:** Hugh McMahan

**Last Race:** May 22, 9th race

**Finish:** 3rd by 1 1/4

Bumped eventual winner Knock Knock when stumbling and coming out at the start in a dirt sprint taken off turf. She recovered to save ground, putting in a steady rally to finish third. Look for a better effort on turf or dirt going long.

### **YOUR LORDSHIP**

**Last Race:** May 30, 7th race

**Finish:** 1st by 2 3/4

It could be a fun 4-year-old summer on the turf for the Graham Motion-trained runner. Racing as a first-time gelding, Your Lordship rated long with plenty of confidence throughout, waited to pounce in the upper stretch, and angled and swept clear for the win

### **PUT A ROCK ON IT**

**Trainer:** Kieron Magee

**Last Race:** May 31, 7th race

**Finish:** 2nd by nose

Tackled males in her first start back from Texas, and gave a strong late rally to just miss the favored Class Photo. She seems very comfortable at distances ranging from a mile to nine furlongs on turf, and would benefit from getting back in with fillies in a starter allowance spot.

## **DOLICE VITA**

**Trainer:** Robin Graham

**Last Race:** May 31, 9th race

**Finish:** 3rd by neck

Broke from the far outside post position going 1 1/16 miles on the main track, and was hung out wide every step of the way. Despite the ground loss, he was trying hard every step to the wire when beaten by a ground-saving, pace-setting winner.

## THE ROUND-UP - by John Piasek, *The Racing Biz*

**Race 1:** Jamie Ness trainees are always dangerous when they're on or near the pace. **Sell It** fit that bill, as he sat off of early leader Return Fire, took advantage when that one tired, and held off Mr. Funtastico to win by less than a length. Mr. Funtastico was blocked in the stretch but closed well once clear; he's one to watch next time, especially since he'll be first off the John Salzman claim.

**Race 2:** Those who bet **Come On Get Happy** breathed a massive sigh of relief when the photo was posted. She opened up a clear early lead and kept odds-on favorite Wiretapped throughout the stretch run, despite that one's best efforts. In the last sixteenth, Wiretapped surged and made it very interesting, but the wire came just in time for Come On Get Happy.

**Race 3:** Cat Fast set the pace and lasted a long way, but **Edelweiss**, who sat off the pace on the rail, eventually wore him down. Keen Talent fell very far behind early, but closed well when well-beaten for third.

**Race 4:** **Laysen** showed speed and stopped badly last out. This time, over a track that appeared to be more speed-favoring, he hit the front and didn't stop to win at 25-1. Magic Wallet closed from next-to-last to be second; an impressive effort given the circumstances.

**Race 5:** **Poker Joker** was making his first start in 440 days, but the layoff didn't slow him down one bit. He tracked the pace on the rail and outkicked Hunter Joe, who raced wide throughout, for the victory. One particular bettor believed in Poker Joker off the bench, and it paid off big-time for them. The early pick 5 was scooped by one winning ticket for over \$36,800.

**Race 6:** Favored **Sin Boldly** hit the front at the top of the lane after a stalking trip. She was surrounded on both sides: Music Box on her inside and Themis on the outside. She dug in and never relented, holding on to break her maiden at fourth asking.

**Race 7:** **Spencer Tiara** couldn't last on the lead last time, but took advantage of this track's speed-favoring nature. She took command and pulled clear easily in the stretch. Sheldon Russell wrapped up on her in the last sixteenth, while Vanilla rallied into second to complete the exacta.

**Race 8:** **River Seine** set the pace and had just enough left to hang on over the late-surgings Mopo.

**Race 9:** Maidstone set the early pace but couldn't last, enabling **Buckin' Right** to take command at the top of the lane and win.
